

Teasdale (31 off 26 balls) and Tom Dearden (19 off 51 balls). Terence Smit (sponsored by Canny Comps) then batted superbly to hit his best score for Aycliffe (71 not out off 70 balls, including ten boundaries) and together with Ben Howard (5 not out off 41 balls), the pair put together an unbeaten 10th wicket partnership of 53, to push Aycliffe's total to a respectable 190 for 9 from their 50 overs. In reply, Middlesbrough kept up with the required run rate, but lost wickets at regular intervals thanks to some good work with the ball by Ben Howard (3 for 37) and Tom Dearden (2 for 37). However, the home side eventually reached their target after 45.4 overs and for the loss of eight wickets.

The second team were well beaten by 146 runs at home to promotion candidates Darlington RA 2nd XI in the NYSD fourth division. The visitors were asked to bat first and scored an impregnable 198 for 5, declared after 37 overs, despite some good bowling from Tom Norman, who took 2 for 27 and Dan Weldon with 2 for 47. In reply, Aycliffe were skittled for 52 after 25.2 overs with only Adam Shaw (11 off 17 balls) and Jai Sander (sponsored by Armstrong Building Services), who scored 10 off 54 balls, reaching double figures.

The club's Ladies team had another comfortable win when they came out on top by 63 runs at home to Hutton Rudby in the Hambleton League. The visitors were asked to bat first and had to contend with some good bowling from Tina Masterman, who took three wickets for just ten runs. Claire Ebdon top scored in the Aycliffe reply with 18 runs off 14 balls and other important contributions came from Tina Masterman (17 off 9 balls), Louise Jackson (14 off 14 balls) and Amanda Norman (13 off 12 balls).

Our U17's put in yet another tremendous performance, this time beating Sedgefield away in a nail biting finish by just one run in the NYSD 100 cup. Electing to bat first, Aycliffe scored an excellent 139 for 4 in their 100 balls thanks to a brilliant unbeaten 84 off 51 balls by captain Tom Dearden and his memorable innings included eight boundaries and six maximums. In reply, the homeside were always up with the run rate, but were pegged back by some superb bowling by Will Dearden, who restricted Sedgefield to just three runs off the last over to finish with the excellent figures of 3 for 7 to help his team to the narrowest of victories. The U17's followed up their win at Sedgefield with an exciting win by just six runs, away at Northallerton in the NYSD Junior League, thanks to outstanding individual performances by the talented Dearden brothers. Choosing to bat first, Aycliffe were restricted to 99 for 8 from their 20 overs with captain Tom Dearden continuing his remarkable form with the bat this year with yet another half century and retiring on 53 off 37 balls, including six boundaries and two sixes. Liam Scott also batted well, scoring 15 off 20 balls and Will Dearden chipped in with 13 off 17 balls. In reply, the homeside were bowled out for 93 after 16.3 overs helped by a superb spell of fast bowling from 15 year old Will Dearden, who finished his four over spell with career best figures of six wickets for just 13 runs. Special mention must also go to wicket keeper Adam Shaw who held three good catches and was involved in two run outs during Northallerton's innings.

The U13's lost by 51 runs, at home to Darlington in the NYACC League. Captain Freddie Lawler put in an excellent individual performance taking 2 for 7 with the ball and then top scoring with 25 off 26 balls with the bat when Aycliffe replied. Miles Telford also deserves credit, finishing with the impressive figures of 2 for 7 from his three overs. The U11's emerged victorious by just 13 runs in a very close game, away at Wolviston, to consolidate 4th place in the NYACC League. Captain Harvey Palmer again top scored in the Aycliffe innings with a solid unbeaten 15 off 14 balls. Aycliffe then fielded and bowled well with Harvey Palmer (1 for 7) and Gracie Hayman (1 for 9) sharing the only two wickets to fall.



The show was the final event of Opera Nova's Outreach Project in Aycliffe, funded by Great Aycliffe Town Council.


The delighted audience included Aycliffe Mayor, Councillor John Clark, as well as families, friends, teachers and regular Opera Nova supporters.

Have Your Say

People are being invited to have their say on a proposal to extend restrictions on the display of letting boards in Durham City.

Durham County Council introduced the restrictions in October 2019 after successfully applying to the Secretary of State for a Regulation 7 Direction.

The direction requires advertisers to submit an application to the council for consent if they wish to display letting boards in the Durham City Conservation Area.

It is due to expire this October and the council is proposing to apply to the Secretary of State to renew it for a further five years.

Stephen Reed, Durham County Council's planning development manager, said: "We introduced the existing controls in response to concerns from residents and businesses over the excessive number of letting boards and the negative visual impact this was having on the historic heart of Durham City.

"The controls have been a success - we receive far fewer complaints than we did prior to their introduction, and there's been a marked visual improvement in the residential streets within the Conservation Area. On that basis, we intend to apply to the Secretary of State for a renewal of the Regulation 7 Direction for a further five years.

"We'd welcome people's views on this and will be including a summary of the feedback we receive in our application.'

Police and Crime Commissioner Joy Allen's proposals to appoint Graham Hall as her new Deputy have been unanimously backed by Durham Police and Crime Panel.

The County Durham and Darlington PCC presented her plans to panel members at a Confirmation Hearing on 1st July 2024. In 2022, Mr Hall was recognised by the Darlington Borough Council Stronger Communities Awards for his contribution to public safety in Darlington. Experienced in policing governance and local government arrangements, Mr Hall has a deep understanding of national, regional and local community groups with the ability to engage at all levels.

Commissioner Allen said: "I am delighted the Police and Crime Panel unanimously approved my decision and I look forward to welcoming Mr Hall to the OPCC team. "Graham's vast experience of policing and community safety will prove an invaluable support to me, and he will provide an insight that is second to none as we work to make County Durham and Darlington safer for evervone.

"As our responsibilities as PCCs grow and evolve, Mr Hall's support will provide additional expertise and capacity to reach and engage with our residents and give a voice to our communities on the issues that are important to them and impact their safety.'

Mr Hall will replace former Deputy PCC Nigel Bryson OBE who stepped down from his parttime role prior to the election.

Mr Hall's position will be on a full-time basis until the conclusion of the PCC's current term of office in May 2028.

Durham Brass Festival 2024

Final touches are being put to preparations for one of the region's most popular music events, with its return just days away. Durham Brass Festival - a week of spectacular performances, new commissions, free concerts, community activities, and a full programme of lively street bands - kicks off its 2024 edition today, Friday 5th July. The Durham County Council event runs until Saturday 13th July and will feature critically acclaimed Public Service Broadcasting as well as returning favourites Spain's Artistas del Gremio and a host of exciting acts making their Brass debuts.

Here's everything you need to know about
