Campaign to Save the World's Oldest Railway Station

The campaign to save the world's oldest railway station, at Heighington in County Durham, has received a major £90,000 boost, but there are fears the surprise general election may have derailed its chances of being ready for the bicentenary next year.

The Railway Heritage Trust¹ is climbing aboard the campaign of the Friends of the Stockton & Darlington Railway to buy and restore Heighington Station on the outskirts of Newton Aycliffe in County Durham by making an 'exceptional' donation which means a substantial part of the £500,000 target has already been raised.

Niall Hammond, Chair of the Friends, "We really welcome this significant help from the trust which is a clear signal to the national, if not international, significance of Heighington as the world's first railway station."

The Grade II* listed station building, which doubled as a pub, was built in 1826, less than a year after the opening of the S&DR, when the concept of passenger waiting rooms was completely new. It therefore plays an important part in the development of the modern railway, which is why the trust has gone out of its way to help.

It is, though, currently derelict, and the Friends fear, if left to rot further, it will be an embarrassing eyesore when the railway celebrates its 200th anniversary next summer. It therefore launched its Save Our Station campaign in February, which has so far raised an amazing £15,000 from public donations.

The Railway Heritage Trust's £90,000 goes with a £10,000 donation from the Headley Trust² to assist with the project's development costs including the appointment of Purcell Architects. Support has come from local councils, including Durham County Council, and even from local masons' lodges, as John Carter, who built the station in 1826, was a mason.

However, the Friends were hoping that they could successfully bid for money allocated by the last Conservative government for 'levelling up', but Rishi Sunak's snap summer election, and subsequent defeat, has thrown that into doubt.

"The Railway Heritage Trust's grant comes at an important time for our campaign as our application to the Community Ownership Fund, which was a major part of our plan, now sits in limbo following the General Election," said Mr Hammond. "We have no idea if the fund is continuing or not."

"Time is now running short to bring Heighington back into use again in time for the bicentenary in 2025 – we need another £250,000 to Save Our Station and complete the purchase, and £150,000 to restore it and bring it back to life and reopen to the public. Every little helps and we are so grateful for donations big and small, and to all those volunteers who have already helped begin taking care of the site."

A further community tidy up of the site is planned for Saturday 27th July.

Two Hundred New Actions To Tackle Climate Change

A North East council is committing to over 200 further actions as part of its ambitions to tackle climate change. Durham County Council's Cabinet has agreed the council's third Climate Emergency Response Plan (CERP3) covering the period 2024 to 2027. It builds on the first two plans, CERP1 and CERP2, the first of which was established in 2020. CERP3 will set out 232 actions to carry out over the next three years to help achieve its targets of reducing council emissions by 80% and achieving net zero emissions for County Durham by 2045.

Through the actions in CERP1 and CERP2, the council has achieved a 61% reduction in its carbon emissions, which have fallen from 105,000 tonnes of carbon dioxide in 2008 to 41,733 tonnes (2022/2023). Cabinet heard that more than 80% of actions in CERP2 (2022 to 2024) are progressing, with 124 of the 150 actions complete or on track.

This includes the decarbonisation of street lights and of heating in council buildings, nature restoration and tree planting programmes and the transformation of Morrison Busty into a low carbon depot.

It also heard how projects are making significant monetary savings through more efficient lighting and the production of the council's own renewable energy. The

Street Light LED Replacement Programme has already saved over £5.5m in unused energy costs and will continue to create savings.

Countywide, actions include the completion of walking and cycling infrastructure for nine of the county's towns; energy efficiency grants awarded to over 500 businesses; over 1000 hectares of blanket bog restoration; expansion of the county's electric vehicle charging infrastructure with 250 new charge points; and progress with the Seaham Garden Village mine water heat programme.

Actions within CERP3 include the continued decarbonisation of council buildings, the roll out of electric vehicles within the council's fleet and continued expansion of charging infrastructure.

It also outlines ambitions to increase biodiversity in council open spaces and to introduce wind turbines at the authority's Hackworth Road depot.

Countywide, actions include public transport improvements, greater low carbon controls within planning applications, and the expansion of renewable energy schemes from the council's partners. CERP3 also lists a wide range of supporting carbon reduction measures from the Local Nature Recovery Strategy currently in development.

NEIGHBOURHOOD POLICING

Hi everyone, here's a brief update of what has been happening over the past week:

On Sunday night a male was arrested on suspicion of affray and was transported to custody.

PCC Backs Calls to Cut Drink-Driving Limit

Police and Crime Commissioner, Joy Allen, has addressed medical experts at a national conference calling on the Government to cut the drink-driving limit.

As the Association of Police and Crime Commissioners' (APCC) lead on drink and drug driving, the PCC was a keynote speaker at the British Medical Association's (BMA) alcohol, drugs and driving consensus statement launch event in London.

The consensus calls for the drink-driving limit in England, Wales and Northern Ireland to be cut from 80mg per 100 millilitres of blood (0.08%), or 35 micrograms per 100 millilitres of breath, to lower levels as seen in other countries. It sets out detailed evidence showing that lowering the legal blood alcohol content (BAC) limit for driving saves lives.

Commissioner Allen said the current threshold in England, Wales and Northern Ireland was one of the highest in the world. Quoting new research highlighted by the BMA, she said drivers drinking up to this limit are six times more likely to be killed in a crash.

She said: "Let's be clear - there is no safe limit. Drinking alcohol impairs driving function at miniscule levels - the evidence is undisputable. It's time to take the data seriously and use the experiences of other nations who have successfully driven down collision rates by lowering the limit. Reducing deaths and injuries on our roads by drink or drug drivers is not only a professional mission but a personal one. Until we make it perfectly clear in law that alcohol and driving don't mix, then more needless lives will be lost on our roads. I fully support the BMA's consensus statement and will continue to lobby for a zero-tolerance approach that will ensure England and Wales can finally address the rate of drink-drive fatalities that have shown no improvement in more than 30 years."

The BMA's consensus highlights laboratory studies that show impairment in critical driving functions begins at low levels, with most subjects significantly impaired at just



0.05% BAC.

Studies from the UK have shown that reducing the BAC limit from 0.08% to 0.05% is effective in preventing collisions while 2010 National Institute for Health and Care Excellence (NICE) estimates suggest more than 150 lives a year could be saved by lowering the BAC limit to this level.

The BMA says a reduction in the BAC limit must be accompanied by other measures to successfully reduce drink-driving. This includes strong enforcement and public awareness campaigns which can successfully contribute to changes in driver behaviour.

Furthermore, the BMA calls for sustained investment in alcohol and drug treatment services and says this is a key component of addressing drink and drug driving harm and the wider harm of alcohol and drugs in society.

Commissioner Allen, who is also the APCC's Joint Lead on Addiction and Substance Misuse, added: "I have been fighting hard to ensure the criminal justice system offers the professional support to help individuals address their dependencies and stop offending. The earlier we identify the signs of problem-drinking, the more we can do to prevent further tragedies and save lives."

New Developments Drive Growth in County

Latest tourism figures show a major boost for Durham's economy as the county builds on its bumper £1bn milestone achieved in 2022, with new attractions playing a key role in helping the county reach a new record.

Visit County Durham, the county's Destination Management Organisation and Durham County Council's tourism service, has welcomed the results which show visitor expenditure rose by 18.8% in 2023, with the value of the county's visitor economy hitting £1.23bn. Overall, 20.15 million people visited the county last year, an increase of 12.5%. The number of people employed in tourism has also grown, up by 12.4% to 13,178. It is welcome news as visitor numbers and employment have now exceeded pre-pandemic figures for the first time*.

New attractions including the Spanish Gallery and Faith Museum, part of The Auckland Project, and further additions to the 1950s Town at Beamish Museum, have been instrumental in the county's success, and with even more significant developments opening this year, the future looks bright for the county's visitor economy.

In the last month alone, New Hall at Locomotion opened to create the largest under cover collection of historic rail vehicles in Europe, and in Durham City, The Story has brought the county's fascinating history to life at the new state-of-the-art history centre. The ambitious development at Raby Castle has also recently opened, with The Rising expanding its visitor offer with reimaged walled gardens, restored heritage buildings and new restaurant showcasing local produce. The county's tourism offer will be enhanced even further this summer, with Return of the Vikings, a new pre-show experience at Kynren, where visitors can experience the recreation of a 9th century village complete with cookhouse, cottages, and a working blacksmith's forge. The much-anticipated 1950s Cinema at Beamish Museum will open just days after visitors were given the chance to visit the new toy shop and electrical store. It doesn't stop there, as visitors will soon be able to stay overnight for the first time at the museum in Georgian-themed accommodation and experience the pottery and tavern.

Cllr Elizabeth Scott, Durham County Council's Cabinet member for economy and partnerships, said: "We are thrilled with the latest economic assessment STEAM results, which are testament to the incredible partnerships across the county that are committed to working together to grow our visitor economy. The county has really shown its potential in the past three years and has greatly benefited from new attractions and developments over recent years and, with more to come, it puts us in a strong position for 2024 and beyond."

Duncan Peake, CEO of Raby Estates and Interim Chair of Visit County Durham added: "These results illustrate the resilience of the county's visitor economy and the investment that is now being made in our visitor offer.



They also show that we have not only survived the challenges of the last few years, but have emerged much stronger.

Right now, across the county you can see new projects coming on stream. Multi-million-pound developments are underway at our visitor accommodation, from hotels to glamping pods, and at attractions including, Locomotion's New Hall, The Rising at Raby Castle, The Auckland Project, and Beamish... and with many more projects in the pipeline, it really is an exciting time for Durham."

Aycliffe Cricket Club Scoreboard Report



Newton Aycliffe's 1st team, sponsored by Franks the Flooring Store, were desperately unlucky to lose by just one wicket at home to Hartlepool 2nd XI in the NYSD second division. Aycliffe were asked to bat first and were bowled out for a disappointing total of 118 after 47 overs with only captain James Layfield-Carroll, who top scored with 41 off 42 balls and an unbeaten 10 off 42 balls by Leo Stout, reaching double figures. In reply, Aycliffe bowled and fielded superbly, making the visitors fight for every run. However, in a nail biting finale, Hartlepool's last wicket pair inched over the winning line after 38.1 overs despite some excellent bowling from both Luke Telford (sponsored by JR Smith Electricals) (4 for 47) and Tom Dearden (3 for 21).

The second team were well beaten by 77 runs away at Northallerton 2nd XI in the NYSD fourth division. The home side chose to bat first and scored an imposing 184 for 4 in their 40 overs with Aycliffe's Tom Norman (2 for 37), Leon Patel (sponsored by Leas Flowers) and Matty Greaves (both taking 1 for 24), taking the only wickets to fall. In reply, Aycliffe lost wickets at regular intervals throughout their innings and were eventually dismissed for 107 after 26.1 overs. The main contributions from the bat came from Charlie Cayless (25 off 20 balls), Ramzan Hussain (25 of 37 balls) and Leon Patel (24 off 41 balls).

The following day the 2nd XI had a comprehensive victory by nine wickets at home to Bedale 2nd XI in the NYSD fourth division. Electing to bowl first, Aycliffe skittled the visitors for just 102 from 33.4 overs with Leon Patel (3 for 17), Leo Mercy (3 for 24) and Matty Greaves (2 for 17) doing the damage with the ball and Greaves also had a day to remember in the field, holding on to four sharp catches. In reply, Wolviston reached their winning target with three overs in hand despite some good bowling from Liam Scott (2 for 17) and Will Moffatt (2 for 19), who shared the four wickets to fall.

The U13's lost by 8 wickets at home to Sedgfield in the NYACC league. Batting first, Aycliffe were dismissed for 55 from 14 overs, despite a superb unbeaten 33 from 24 balls by acting captain Trent Telford. In reply, the home side reached their winning target after 9.4 overs with Jonah Harrop and Dan Collett taking the only two wickets to fall.

The following evening, the U13's were beaten again despite a much improved performance, this time by six wickets at home to Northallerton. Aycliffe batted first and reached 96 for 4 in their 20 overs thanks to good innings from Freddie Lawler and Jonah Harrop, who both retired not out 30 and Carys Myers who chipped in with 10 not out at the end. In reply, Aycliffe captain Freddie Lawler removed both of the Northallerton openers to give his side a good start, but the visitors clawed their way into the game and duly reached their winning target after 15.3 overs and for the loss of four wickets.

The U11's were well beaten by 117 runs at home to top of the table Richmond in the NYACC League despite some encouraging performances with the ball from captain Harvey Palmer (3 for 13), Carys Myers (2 for 13) and Gracie Hayman (1 for 23).

Don't Miss Out on a Tax Refund for Work Expenses

HM Revenue and Customs (HMRC) is reminding employed workers they can claim a refund on work-related expenses directly through **gov.uk**. More than 800,000 taxpayers claimed refunds for work expenses during the 2021 to 2022 tax year, but while the average claim was £125, over 70% of claimants missed out on getting the full amount they were due because they used an agent to make their claim instead of claiming directly with HMRC. It is quick and easy to claim a tax refund directly through HMRC's online portal on **gov.uk**, and the only way to guarantee receiving 100% of the repayment - with no small print and no middlemen taking a cut. Submitting a claim through HMRC's online portal is straightforward and takes about fifteen minutes. Customers can use the handy online tool to check eligibility and a full list of work expenses they can claim including:

- Uniforms and work clothing
- Buying work-related equipment
- Professional fees, union memberships, and subscriptions
- Using their own vehicle for work travel (excluding journey from home to work).

Customers who already have a Government Gateway account can follow the step-by-step guidance to submit their claim. Those who need to set an account up can do so quickly and easily via **gov.uk**. For customers who are considering using a repayment agent, HMRC is reminding them to be aware that an agent always charges for services - in some cases up to 50% of the value of the claim. And, while initially it may seem simpler, customers will need to supply the agent with the same information they could use to make the claim themselves using HMRC's free online portal.

It is important customers understand what they are signing up to. Before signing a contract with a repayment agent, they should research the company and always check the small print to ensure they understand what commission is being charged and how much of their tax refund they are likely to receive back. Customers can find out more about how to make a work-related expense claim and what type of expense they can claim at **gov.uk**

Pathway to a Brighter Future



An innovative scheme aimed at preventing anti-social behaviour is helping young people find their pathway to a brighter future. More than 70 young people from the Darlington area have already taken part in the Future Pathways initiative over the past two years, as part of a successful programme supported by Durham Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) Joy Allen through Safer Streets 4 funding.

Earlier this year, the PCC allocated further funding to support the ASB Prevention Programme, which links activity with issues affecting the community. There are currently 22 young people from across Darlington and Stanley taking part in the programme. Darlington Borough Council's Young People's Engagement and Justice Service has been working closely with Future Pathways to identify young people, and their parents/carers who would benefit from the programme. Sessions so far have covered a range of topics including online safety and social media usage, vaping awareness, drugs, alcohol and tobacco awareness and offensive weapons. Future sessions will focus on ASB, peer pressure and British values.

The latest session has seen Future Pathways bring businesses and education providers together for a special Career Aspirations Event to focus on employability and help young people find their path and learn more about the opportunities open to them in the local area.

Durham PCC Joy Allen added: "Anti-social behaviour strikes at the very heart of our communities, eroding confidence and heightening fear. For too long, residents have felt let down by the system designed to keep them safe, while perpetrators have faced little consequence or punishment for their actions. This must change.

"Through this new programme, we will educate young people to respect the law and their neighbours and support them and their families to prevent further unwanted behaviour which could lead to more serious criminality if left unchecked.

"Enforcement by itself cannot solve the lawlessness on our streets. Young people need strong guidance at an early age to fulfil their potential, especially when their family support network is missing. Prevention first is a key strategy in my Police and Crime Plan and I am excited to work with partners on this exciting scheme to make County Durham and Darlington safer, stronger and more resilient to crime, drug and anti-social behaviour."
