Exciting Times for Greenfield



Exciting new plans for modern teaching facilities at Greenfield Academy have been approved by Durham County Council. The new development marks a significant milestone for the school, promising a state-of-the-art learning environment for its students and staff.

Most of the outdated and "horrendous" existing buildings will be demolished upon the completion of a new three-storey teaching block. The new structure will be constructed in the current car park to the north of the school, allowing the majority of the current school operations to continue without disruption. Only two existing teaching areas and the sports centre will be retained at the Greenfield Way site.

The approved plans, submitted in partnership with local construction firm Kier Group, have been carefully designed to minimize disruption to staff and pupils, avoiding the need for advanced demolition. This phased approach ensures that teaching can continue in the existing buildings while the new facilities are being built.

Durham County Council emphasised the necessity of this development, noting that the existing buildings have reached the end of their design life. A council spokesperson commented, "The existing blocks to be demolished have reached the end of their design life and the replacement will facilitate a more functional, welcoming, and efficient layout for the school's everyday operations and needs."

Councillor Michael Stead, representing Aycliffe North and Middridge, praised the project, highlighting the significant improvement it will bring to the teaching and learning environment. He stated, "A new build for the school is well overdue. When I first became a councillor, I walked that site and the amount of single-pane windows and heating issues was horrendous. There were temporary buildings put outside, with classrooms in portacabins. It's just not acceptable for children of this day and age to be in a school like that."

Amy Aspland, Head of School for Greenfield Academy, expressed her enthusiasm for the new development, saying, "This new teaching block is a long-awaited upgrade that will vastly improve the learning environment for both our children and staff, who deserve to learn and work in an environment that is bright, welcoming and fit for purpose. It marks a new chapter for Greenfield Academy, where we can continue to provide high-quality education in a modern and supportive setting."

The new build will see the student admission numbers with capacity for up to 750 students. Greenfield Academy will continue to serve students from years seven to eleven, including those with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND). The phased construction work is set to begin in September, with the new site expected to welcome pupils by September 2025. Following the completion of the new buildings, demolition of the old structures will commence, alongside the development of a new playground and parking facilities. This new build will further support the school's new developed ethos to provide 'every child with every opportunity, every day'.

Local Unrest

One person has been arrested following violent disorder in Darlington this week.

Dozens of police officers were deployed to the North Lodge Park area after two large groups of mostly males had gathered shortly after

This resulted in small pockets of serious violence, which saw bricks being thrown at police officers who attended the scene. An 18-year-old man has been arrested on suspicion of violent disorder, assaulting a police officer and possession of a controlled drug. He has been taken to police custody where he remains.

Section 60 and 60AA powers have been authorised in the area, giving officers enhanced stop and search capabilities and authority to order people to remove face coverings which are intended to disguise or conceal their appearance.

Assistant Chief Constable Richie Allen, from Durham Constabulary, said: "What we have been dealing with tonight in Darlington has been sporadic pockets of violent disorder involving groups of people intent on causing serious harm to our communities and their

"We deployed a number of officers to the scene who worked throughout the night to disperse those involved.

"We were supported by officers from Cleveland and Northumbria Police and were assisted by our partners at the fire and ambulance service at the scene, for which I am grateful.

"We will not tolerate violent disorder in our communities. If you were there committing criminal acts, we will do everything in our power to find you and deal with you robustly." Aycliffe Cricket Club Scoreboard Report



Newton Aycliffe's 1st team, sponsored by Franks the Flooring Store, lost by a huge 110 runs away at Saltburn 2nd XI in the NYSD second division. The home side chose to bat first and rattled up an impregnable score of 263 for 5 in their allotted 50 overs despite some excellent bowling by captain James Layfield-Carroll, who took 4 for 45 from his 15 overs. In reply, half centuries from both Tom Dearden (sponsored by Kevin Burton) (56 from 58 balls) and Chris Palmer (52 off 57 balls) briefly gave Aycliffe hope but, once they were dismissed, the innings fizzled out and they were eventually bowled out for 153 after 39.2 overs.

The second team were beaten by seven wickets at home to Maltby 2nd XI in the NYSD fourth division. Aycliffe were asked to bat first and opener Patrick Howe, playing only his second game of the season, was in scintillating form, carrying his bat for a superb unbeaten 92 off 104 balls and his career best innings included 13 boundaries and two sixes. With Aycliffe struggling at 81 for 7, Howe was joined at the crease by 13 year old Trent Telford and the pair batted brilliantly to set a new second team club partnership record for the 8th wicket of 94. Telford recorded his senior career best score of 37 off 51 balls, including five boundaries and with Matty French also batting well with 23 off 29 balls, Aycliffe were eventually dismissed for 180 off 37.2 overs. In reply, the visitors aggressively attacked the Aycliffe bowling and guickly reached their winning target after 26.5 overs with only Leon Patel (2 for 38) and captain Dan Weldon (1 for 28) having any success with the ball. The club's Ladies team took part in the Durham Ladies Megafest Tournament at the Seat Unique Riverside Stadium, home of Durham County Cricket Club, on Sunday 4th August and came out on top after winning all four games against Eppleton, Seaham Harbour, Sacriston and Murton Ladies Cricket teams. A great achievement by the Aycliffe

The following night, the ladies, who are the defending champions, had an impressive 67 run victory at home to Rockliffe Park in the Prestigious NYSD 100 Pairs cup quarter final, thanks to a great team effort in the field, and this was followed by some excellent batting from Tina Masterman (29 off 17 balls), Claire Ebdon (27 not out off 12 balls), Addison Jones (14 not out off 13 balls) and Anneliese Myers (13 not out off 11 balls).

In reply, Aycliffe battled hard and were 77 for 7 after 20 overs despite a defiant innings by Freddie Lawler who batted superbly to finish unbeaten on 43 from 54 balls faced and included 8 boundaries. Credit must also go to 10 year old Morgan Jones, who batted really well, scoring 7 not out off 22 balls and sharing an unbroken 8th wicket partnership of 37 with Lawler at the end of the Aycliffe innings.

The U13's put in a good performance but, unfortunately, still lost by five wickets at home to Darlington RA in the NYACC league. Aycliffe batted first and scored 81 for 7 in their overs, thanks to another excellent innings from in-form Trent Telford who retired on 32 from 22 balls faced. In reply, RA comfortably reached their winning target after 16.1 overs and five wickets in hand with nine year old Harvey Palmer the pick of the bowlers taking 3 for 10 from his three overs.

The U11's put in a terrific performance away at Darlington and were desperately unlucky to lose a very close game by just two runs in the NYACC League. Nine year old Captain Harvey Palmer continued his excellent form with the bat when he top scored with 12 not out from 13 balls faced. Baby Skeleton Found

The body of a little baby, discovered during a Bishop Auckland house renovation, lay concealed beneath floorboards for more than 100 years

Detectives investigating the discovery of a skeleton at a house in Fore Bondgate believe the body has lain undisturbed since the early 20th Century.

The baby was wrapped in newspaper which has deteriorated over the years, but investigators were able to identify a fragment which dated to

Forensic examination has also established that the baby was full term at 40 weeks, but have been unable to firmly establish the gender. Officers have also identified twine wrapped around the baby's neck, indicating that the cause of the death is likely to have been suspicious.

Further forensic tests are taking place over the coming weeks, including carbon dating, to confirm the initial findings.

Detectives from Durham Constabulary are now attempting to trace historic records for the

property between 1900 and 1920 as part of efforts to identify who lived there at that time. The property dates to the Victorian period and at one stage housed a church-run mother and baby unit, although it is believed that the baby was concealed before that time.

Detective Chief Inspector Mel Sutherland, from Durham Constabulary, said: "The evidence suggests this has happened a very long time ago, which makes investigating the circumstances extremely difficult, but we still have a duty to that baby. My focus is on finding out who the baby is, what happened and how it came to be under the floorboards of that house. As soon as we are able to, I am determined that this little baby is given an appropriate and dignified funeral."

Police are now gathering historical information about the house's ownership from 1900 to 1920, including securing records and tracing family trees to potentially identify any living relatives. They were joined by festival favourite Chris Bavin who returned to Seaham to host on the cookery stage.



If and when you see a hog out in the day the poor thing is not ok whatever their size, please pick them up and put them in a high sided box with a towel to hide in, then get them help, they are totally harmless, not flea ridden, totally desperate for help, they have a terrible life in the wild with so many difficulties to face which they don't deserve and I am glad to be here for them.

Thank you to Elaine for bringing in a very small female, (pictured) she is quite unwell but I am doing everything in my power and medicine cupboard to make her better, she is a mere 200 grams and has an awful parasite burden, please wish her well and also the newly released hedgehogs.

I want to start by thanking everyone who's emailed or written to me with local concerns or issues. My constituency office team have now started and we're working hard to make sure all of the issues are picked up. If you'd like to contact me, you can get in touch via email to: alan.strickland.mp@parliament.uk

My last week in Parliament, before recess, was a busy one. Safeguarding the 700 world-class engineering jobs at Hitachi Rail in Newton Aycliffe remains a top priority for me as your MP. Following a site visit to the plant with other regional MPs, I led a meeting for MPs from around the North East with the Transport Secretary in Parliament. I was pleased to hear that ministers have got civil servants working at pace to explore all available options with the Hitachi management team.

I also met trade union officials at the plant to update them and discuss the important issue of how we maintain as many jobs at the factory as we can, despite the very difficult situation they were left in.

I'll be in regular contact with Transport Ministers, Hitachi senior leaders and union representatives to keep the pressure on to push for this to be resolved.

Whilst in Westminster, I was honoured to be appointed Parliamentary Private Secretary to the Education Secretary. This role means I'll work closely with Bridget Phillipson MP and her ministerial team to deliver Labour's ambitious education policies. This includes free breakfast clubs, recruiting 6500 more teachers, childcare in 3000 nurseries and providing mental health support in every school.

Back here at home, I've been working closely with the Northern Echo to put pressure on the Environment Agency to tackle the unpleasant smell that residents in Aycliffe Village, the town and surrounding areas have been complaining about for many months. I've written a joint letter to the Environment Agency with Darlington MP Lola McEvoy whose constituents in Brafferton and North Darlington are also affected. We've requested an urgent update, a site visit, results from the air quality testing they've undertaken with the UK Health Security Agency and a public meeting with officials to set out the latest to residents. Finally, I've been appalled by the rioting and disorder that we've seen, including in parts of the North East. This has only involved very small numbers of people, but has caused serious damage to local businesses and community centres, as well as leaving police officers hospitalised. Our Prime Minister, Keir Starmer, has been clear that violence on Britain's streets will never be tolerated. The government has courts on standby to sentence violent offenders, 24 hours a day, to ensure justice is done clearly and swiftly. Anyone found to be attacking people, properties or the police should expect to be dealt with very severely. We are a proud, civilised nation where this sort of organised criminality will not go unpunished.

Aycliffe is a strong and longstanding community. We will rise above the hate and division that a tiny minority of people are trying to ferment on social media. We are stronger together.

On Saturday 10th August Newton Aycliffe FC open their second NPL East campaign with a trip to the world's oldest football club, Sheffield FC. Sheffield FC have already played one competitive game this season, winning 2-1 at home against NPL-West side Nantwich Town in the FA Cup Extra Preliminary Round. Luke Mangham kicked off the scoring for the home side in the 28th minute until they were pegged back in the second half by Nantwich's Byron Harrison. Sheffield FC would be the next to score, however, and Luke Aldrich's 76th minute goal confirmed Sheffield's progress into the next round. **Emlev**

Aycliffe's first home game of the season sees newly promoted Emley visit Moore Lane on Tuesday 13th August (KO 7.45pm). Emley finished 2023-24 as the champions of the Northern Counties East League, earning them promotion to Step 4.



Child Care Financial Support

From 1st September 2024, 15 hours childcare will be expanded to eligible working parents with children aged 9 months old up to 3 years old. Parents are being urged to visit Childcare Choices to check what support they might be eligible for and how to apply:

From Empty Building to Vital Community Hub

More than 1,000 cups of coffee, six hundred pots of tea, 500 breakfast buns and countless slices of homemade cake have been served in a community-run shop, café and heritage centre in its first month.

When Cotherstone in Teesdale lost its shop and post office, residents took matters into their own hands, transforming the



village's former Methodist Chapel into a place where locals and visitors can shop, socialise and celebrate the area's heritage.

The Old Chapel opened in June, following years of hard work and fundraising by the community, which raised an impressive £120,000 towards the project. This was boosted by a £120,000 grant from Durham County Council's Towns and Villages Community Resilience Fund; £40,000 from Teesdale Area Action Partnership's Towns and Villages Fund; and a total of £20,000 from Cllr Richard Bell and Cllr Ted Henderson's neighbourhood budgets.

This week, Cllr James Rowlandson, the council's Cabinet member for resources, investment and assets, joined Cllr Bell and Cllr Henderson on a tour of the building, which now includes a café and shop selling a range of household and kitchen essentials.

The councillors also learned about the positive difference the venue is making, including:

- Providing employment to 12 people, the majority of which live in the Cotherstone area.
- Serving more than 2,500 customers.
- Raising £300 for local causes by selling ice creams at Cotherstone
