



Gambling Survey Newton **Highlights Needs Aycliffe RUFC**

Police and Crime Commissioner Joy Allen has renewed her calls for more effective treatment for offenders with gambling addictions on the back of a major new survey.

The Gambling Survey for Great Britain, launched by the Gambling Commission, provides an unprecedented insight into gambling participation rates across the UK, the experiences and reasons for gambling and the consequences on people's lives and those closest to them

It found that half of the survey's 10,000 participants had taken part in some form of gambling in the previous month, and that 2.5 per cent had struggled with problem gambling. Furthermore, more than one in 40 who had gambled in the last year had experienced severe harm to their life such as turning to crime to finance gambling.

As the Association of Police and Crime Commissioners' (APCC) Joint Addictions Lead, the PCC has fought vigorously for tougher regulation of the industry to hold the sector to account for the consequences of gambling harm, including lobbying for improved betting rules to protect problem gamblers and safeguard children from being drawn into gambling addiction.

She has also spearheaded sweeping local reforms in Durham which saw the force become the first in the country to sign up to the Gambling Charter. This agreement set out the Constabulary's commitment to work collaboratively to tackle gambling harm in the workplace and wider community.

Commissioner Allen said: "The evidence from this survey reinforces previous research that for a small minority of people, gambling is a source of significant harm to both themselves,

"It is imperative we take proactive action, rather than reacting to these problems once they become out of control and harm our wider communities. This means doing more to identify, assess and refer offenders with gambling problems into treatment and other support services and rolling out increased protections across the industry to minimise the risk of vulnerable people, including children, developing gambling problems in the first place.



Show Promise

The final score of 46-12 to Richmondshire doesn't reflect the competitive nature of much of the game.

Despite the loss, Aycliffe's performance was full of positives. The team showcased solid defence for long periods and displayed flashes of exciting, expansive rugby that bodes well for the season ahead. Every player who donned the Aycliffe shirt gave their all, showing a spirit and determination that left supporters optimistic for future fixtures.

Jason Mclean, was named Man of the Match for his captain's performance. Mclean led from the front with strong carries, neat offloads, and that crucial try when the team needed a lift. The electric post-match atmosphere in the Aycliffe camp was a testament to the team's spirit and potential. There was a palpable sense that this match, despite the result, was a solid foundation upon which to build their

Aycliffe extends their respect and good wishes to Richmondshire for the season ahead, acknowledging a well-played game between two teams with mutual respect.

The squad now looks forward to preparing for their next pre-season clash against Jarrow. If this opening fixture is anything to go by, rugby fans in the area are in for an exciting season of rugby from Newton Aycliffe RUFC.

Once we've met at one of my surgeries, my staff and I will pick up your issues with the relevant authorities to see what can be done.

Once my constituency office is fully set up, I will be able to provide a direct phone line to my team.

There's a strict convention that Members of Parliament only take up cases from residents living in their constituency, so please make sure to include your name and address in the email.

There's likely to be high demand for slots at my surgeries, so I will prioritise residents facing urgent problems or complex issues that most benefit from an in-person chat. Residents who are booked in for a meeting will be sent a time slot and the address of the venue being used for the surgery.

If my surgery appointments are oversubscribed, or the dates and times aren't convenient for you, don't worry. There are lots of ways I can help. For residents who can't make a surgery, my team and I can provide help by phone, email, video call or a meeting at another time.

Safety and security

Unfortunately, these days, Members of Parliament do have to take safety and security into account when organising surgeries. Security measures will be in place at surgeries to ensure the safety of residents, myself and my team.

Vigilance Urged as Records Decline in Fire Incidents

Data from the Home Office reveals a significant decline in fire incidents at non-domestic buildings in County Durham. Between 2019 and 2023, fire and rescue services attended 513 incidents, representing a 15% decrease from the previous five years. The decline underscores the effectiveness of the work that County Durham and Darlington Fire and Rescue does with local organisations to raise awareness about fire safety practices. Coupled with the introduction of new regulations – such as the October 2023 update to the Home Office's fire safety reform programme, which mandates comprehensive fire risk assessments for all businesses – this demonstrates the impact of proactive measures. Ansvar, an expert provider of insurance for the



charity, care, not-for-profit, and faith sectors, is emphasising the importance of continued vigilance.

£100m Plan for 500 Council **Houses Takes Step Forward**

A £100m project to deliver hundreds of new council houses across County Durham has taken a major step forward, with the appointment of a delivery partner. Durham County Council is planning to provide 500 properties, a mix of bungalows and houses that will be truly affordable and let on secure tenancies, and has appointed Bishop Auckland company T. Manners to help deliver them.

Cllr James Rowlandson, the council's Cabinet member for resources, investments and assets, said: "We are in the midst of a national housing crisis. Not enough properties are being built to meet demand - including the need for affordable housing and many families are struggling financially in the wake of the recent spikes in inflation and interest rates. County Durham is no different to the rest of the country in that regard and that is why we have taken up the government's invitation for councils to address the shortage.

"We are looking to deliver 500 properties across County Durham, with a mix of bungalows and houses, for the benefit of local people and those in housing need. This programme will see an investment in the county of around £100m - a significant boost for our economy. It will protect existing jobs and create new jobs in the construction industry, and associated supply

"In keeping with our County Durham Pound project, the ability to drive longterm social, economic and environmental benefits, or social value, is fundamentally important to us. It's great therefore to be working in partnership with a locally owned family business to deliver this ambitious programme, which will make a significant difference to those in housing need across the county.

"We look forward to announcing more details of this exciting programme as the sites we are planning to develop progress." The council disposed of its housing stock in 2015 to County Durham Housing Group, now Believe housing. In recent times, the number of affordable properties built in County Durham has not matched the identified need - 836 houses per year. In the five years between 2017/18 and 2021/22, the number of new affordable properties delivered (2,647) was 36.7 per cent below the number needed (4,180). The council's new programme will see houses built mainly on land already in the authority's ownership.

PCC Celebrates Handover Day



Police and Crime Commissioner Joy Allen has taken ownership of the keys to the new state-of-the-art Durham Investigative Hub from lead developer Tilbury Douglas, marking an important milestone in the project's progress.

The building, which represents the largest investment ever undertaken by the PCC and the Constabulary, will replace the force's ageing custody facilities and provides a new home for an array of investigative and forensic capabilities to improve evidence gathering and secure more convictions for victims of crime.

Developed on land near Spennymoor, the new two-storey Hub provides more than 6,600m2 of modern accommodation including 48 custody cells, office space, interview rooms and Crime Scene Investigation (CSI) provision. It also houses evidence stores, virtual courts, CCTV. an energy centre, medical facilities and forensic examination rooms. The investment will transform the operational capability of Durham Constabulary and dramatically improve the wellbeing and safety of officers and staff, and their working conditions, while also enhancing the safety of prisoners, Crime Scene Investigation capability and the handling of evidence.

Work will now continue to fit out the extensive accommodation ahead of staff and officers moving in which will start later in the year. Commissioner Allen said: "This is a proud moment for everyone who has contributed to this ambitious project. It marks the start of an exciting period in our history and is warmly welcomed by the workforce. "These advanced facilities will have a far-reaching impact on our ability to effectively investigate crime and secure justice for victims of crime. They will also greatly improve the safety of detainees and over the longer term deliver operational efficiencies to be reinvested in frontline

Our police officers and staff work relentlessly to keep the communities of County Durham and Darlington safe. It is important to me that they work in an environment that is fit for purpose and conducive to their wellbeing and needs, while also equipped with the technology and tools they need to do a good job."

The project has been intentionally designed to improve local opportunities, life chances and wellbeing for local people. The PCC, who is the Association of Police and Crime Commissioners' (APCC) Joint Lead for Environment and Sustainability, took the decision to include social value principles in procurement tenders to encourage successful bidders to award goods and service contracts to organisations based in County Durham and Darlington and the North East region. The PCC is delighted to have secured total social value exceeding £25 million including exceeding targets for employability, responsible business, wellbeing, environment and improvement categories

The development has seen Durham Constabulary become the first in the country to utilise Blue Light Commercial Social Value toolkit. The toolkit was designed to help current and future suppliers of police forces across the country develop their own social value action plans. The hub will centralise the force's existing custody facilities with existing suites in Darlington and Durham City closing and Peterlee custody suite retained as a contingency measure.

The new building will facilitate 24/7 cover by medical staff which cannot currently be achieved across three sites. This will greatly reduce the number of police hours currently lost by transporting detainees to hospital and waiting in A&E for hundreds of hours a year, instead of being on the streets, catching criminals.

It will also allow the force to more effectively monitor and maintain the safety of prisoners while they remain in custody.

Aycliffe Cricket Club Scoreboard Report

Aycliffe chose to bowl first and restricted the visitors to 157 for 4 from their

In reply, Aycliffe got off to a good start thanks to opener Patrick Howe, who hit his second consecutive half century, finishing with an excellent 66 from 97 balls, including nine boundaries and Leo Mercy, who supported him well scoring 27 off 77 balls. With the chance of victory in their sights, Aycliffe upped the tempo and despite a run a ball 13 by Matty Greaves, a robust 21 from 22 balls by Adam Shaw and an unbeaten 12 off 21 balls by Leon Patel, Aycliffe's innings eventually closed on 149 for 5 after their allotted 40 overs.

The results from Saturday's games meant that the 2nd team again played the team at the top of the table in their game on Bank Holiday Monday when they hosted new league leaders

Billingham Synthonia 2nd XI in a real humdinger of a game. The visitors chose to bat first and were dismissed for just 111 after 32.5 overs thanks to some excellent bowling by Ramzan Hussain (3 for 26), Matty Greaves (2 for 13) and Jai Sander (2 for 22). In reply, Aycliffe got off to a good start with opener Patrick Howe continuing his good form with 29 off 50 balls taking his side to 47 for 1. Aycliffe then lost four wickets for 14 runs before captain Dan Weldon smashed 20 off 22 balls to put his side back in the game at 85 for 5 and needing only 28 to win. Leon Patel batted superbly and held the innings together but in an incredibly tense finale, he was the last man out for a gallant 15 off 42 balls as Aycliffe fell to an agonising defeat by just one run. Despite losing by the narrowest of margins, it was an outstanding performance by the 2nd team against the division's top team, especially as all 11 players in the Aycliffe team had uniquely all come through the club's junior set up. Aycliffe's U11's were well beaten by 155 runs in a one sided game away at Northallerton in their final game of the season in the NYACC League. Nine year old captain Harvey Palmer, again emerged with credit after a good all round display, firstly taking 2 for 28 with the ball and then top scoring with 10 runs off 14 balls in the Aycliffe innings.
