Three generations of butchers and bakers at this Newton Aycliffe establishment have kept it a mainstay of top quality products for over 54 years.

Walkers Family Butchers and Bakers, in Newton Aycliffe, has made the top ten of The Northern Echo's search for the best bakery in the region

Don Walker, 81, still oversees the family business alongside son Colin and grandson Scott, and says he'll 'never retire'.

He said: "We serve and supply many local businesses around the town and Business Park, and have two little vans running about. We sell a lot of pies, sandwiches, cakes and bread buns - about 300 dozen buns each day."

Walkers bakers start at 5.30am, with the shop opening at 8.00am daily.

"We used to be supplied by Taylor's of Darlington, but when Covid hit we had to rely on ourselves, so our baking just grew from there. I'm still running the business day to day, and we have twelve of us altogether working here. It is like a family and I just love it. I'm so pleased my son and grandson are working here alongside me to carry it on. I love the people, and you never know what is going to happen from one day to the next. I have put a lot of work into the business, and I'm very proud of it."

Mr Walker, also a Rotarian of 44 years, said the business had seen through good times and bad times, but the shop was still where he'd rather spend his days.

"I never want to retire, what would I do all day? There's always something happening here."

Mr Walker said at Christmas, the bakers can turn out around 1000 dozen bread buns, as well as all the meat and pies people could want. DURHAM POLICE AND CRIME COMMISSIONER

Starting at midnight on 24th September 2024, it will become a criminal offence to possess a 'zombie-style' knife or machete along with a ban on their manufacture, importation, sale and supply.

Zombie-style knives and machetes are defined as weapons with blades over eight inches (20cm) in length that normally have a serrated cutting

As your Police and Crime Commissioner I want to help you comply with this change by making you aware of the Home Office surrender and compensation scheme which will run from 26th August to 23rd September 2024. Lawful owners of these knives will be able to claim compensation for the items in most cases, if the total value of the items is more than £30. Those who give up their weapons during this time period will not be arrested or face prosecution. However, the government has warned that anyone found with zombie-style knives and machetes following the ban will face jail time. That is why I am urging anyone in possession of these dangerous weapons to surrender them before this new law takes effect.

We need to get these knives off our streets. Knife crime is destroying lives, devastating families and creating fear and trauma in communities. Over the last ten years knife crime has increased by more than 80%, so I welcome this new governments mission to halve knife crime within

Before you surrender a knife or machete:

- Wrap it in something, such as a towel, and carry it in a bag to prevent injury;
- Knives must not be carried openly at any time so they do not cause distress or alarm to other members of the public;
- Carrying bladed articles in public without a
- good reason or lawful authority is an offence; Ensure your local police station enquiry office is open before you make the journey;
- At the police station do not take the item out until you're asked to do so by a police officer or a member of police staff.

Discussions on Knife Crime



Recently, Rotary Newton Aycliffe took part in a training day facilitated by two members of Middlesbrough Erimus Rotary Club. It was held at Middlesbrough College and tackled the very difficult subject of knife crime. The event was attended by 20 plus Rotarians from across the south of District 1030, representatives of college staff, Cleveland Unit for Reduction of Violence and business sponsors of the equipment used.

The initiative is being progressed by Rotarians Jacqui Molyneux and Mike Overy of Erimus Rotary and the training was delivered by staff from Midlands based company, Virtual Decisions. Virtual Reality headsets are worn by attendees to put across scenarios which prompt responses then that information is discussed in workshops. The immersive experience is meant to provoke reactions to real life situations which challenges perceptions about the impact of knife crime on individuals and communities.

The intention is to roll the programme out across schools and, in Birmingham, it has already been delivered to 15,000 pupils ranging in age from 11 to 14 years old. It could also be useful for such as scout groups, youth clubs, etc. However, the VR equipment is expensive and the search for sponsorship, funding, grant aid is ongoing.

As September starts, Parliament has resumed its normal business in Westminster. That means that, after a busy summer meeting public sector and community leaders locally, I'm back to Parliament most of the working week, standing up for our area.

It has continued to be a busy time in the constituency, with me and my team working hard to respond to hundreds of individual cases from constituents relating to all matters from benefits to bus services, doing everything we can to support our residents and communities. I'm proud that we've responded to 1000 letters and emails so far. I've prioritised helping residents with the most urgent cases, so, if you've been in touch and haven't yet received a response, we're working on it and you should hear from me soon.

Since being elected in July, one of my main priorities has been to establish a strong team of staff to support my work both here at home and in Westminster. It's really important that local MPs have skilled and committed teams in place to support them in being able to advocate for local constituents and causes.

I want to thank firstly, everyone who acted quickly to get in touch with me about hedgehogs that needed to come into rescue. Firstly, George and Stephen who brought in Alex on Saturday, bless him, he is a beautiful boy, also Diane Louise who asked me to collect Primrose, Shafto Way, Dinah who found the little one on Monday night by the TA Centre, sadly she passed away a few hours after arrival, she was so small and where she was, there was no food or water for her. I have also admitted one from Greta Bridge, a little female, a baby 172g from Ferryhill Station and also one from West Auckland with an injured back leg, none of these hedgehogs are adult, they are juveniles, all may need overwintering, totally busy but I won't turn a hedgehog in trouble away.

What I need everyone to know is that these little hedgehogs are very sick when they are seen out during the day, all I ask is that as soon as you see one out in the day they are not ok, watching them for a couple of days to see what happens is unacceptable and this is still happening, they are totally harmless, inoffensive and welcome the help that you give him or her. They don't have fleas or any external parasites that can harm you. I have in the past, taken my coat off my back to wrap a poorly hedgehog up to take into my rescue. I bring them home, they are in the house which is brilliant, because if I am worried about one I come down during the night. Even hand rearing hoglets has been done in the house. It's extremely hard work being a Rehabber, every day brings a different problem to which I have to find a solution for.

I have had some very generous donations which go to benefit my hoggies, thank you John, Jackie and John Connell and Lynda. I have used some of the money to purchase a suction machine, this is a quick and easy way of removing flystrike which is every hedgehog and rehabbers nightmare. I haven't had one as yet, so having it here will be a lifesaver for poorly hogs.

Pictured is a beautiful baby that I collected from Ferryhill Station on Sunday morning, she is doing well and she will be overwintered.

Charity Helping Residents

A charity promoting volunteering across County Durham and Darlington has secured a £10k grant to help communities build resilience and

Police and Crime Commissioner Joy Allen has provided £10k to Durham Community Action (DCA) as part of a joint funding deal with Durham County Council to support its activities in 2024-25.

The charity is also in discussions with the Commissioner to acquire additional funding to establish a bespoke volunteer development and training programme within the PCC's office to build on her vision to promote volunteering in community safety roles.

DCA, which was one of the first organisations nationally to achieve reaccreditation from the Volunteer Centre Quality Accreditation, is a charity providing advice, support and assistance to front line voluntary and community groups working across County Durham and Darlington. Staff work closely with groups and individual volunteers to identify their needs, help them secure funding and resources and provide the support and encouragement they need to make a difference to their communities. The charity also supports the development of best practice in volunteering organisations and promotes community-led action and engagement through partnership working and capacity building. DCA supports all six of the PCC's current Police and Crime Plan priorities. In the past year alone, the organisation has delivered an extensive programme of training and events including the delivery of Cyber Security sessions for 64 people from VCS organisations and Understanding Safeguarding/ Introduction to Safeguarding workshops for

In addition, DCA directly supported 27 online volunteer applications to the Commissioner's Community Peer Mentors service. This service supports the recovery of vulnerable and isolated people affected by significant life-changing events including crime and antisocial behaviour and neighbourly disputes.

The charity is also expanding opportunities for the recruitment of exoffenders into volunteering roles with the aid of a new risk assessment tool kit developed by a key partner and continues its role as regional local lead in VCS emergency response with the National Association for Voluntary and Community Action (NAVCA). The role promotes the sharing of best practice and positive inclusion of people facing inequalities in communities in the planning work around local and national emergency situations.

Commissioner Allen said: "I am proud of DCA's work across our county in helping our communities to thrive and remain connected. This grant is part of a three-year joint funding deal that will enable the charity to plan with certainty for the future and expand the excellent networking and skills training opportunities it provides in support of my goal to developer stronger and more resilient communities.

"Volunteers play such a vital role in preventing crime, not only supporting the police and other emergency services during times of crisis and peak demand but by helping local people to become resilient so they do not become dependent on front line services.

"I am especially grateful for DCA's contribution to my Community Peer Mentors service which has benefited significantly from the charity's advice and support over the years, and its identification of talented and experienced volunteers who are well-placed to give back to their communities. Volunteers are the glue that binds communities together, helping people to live safe and prosperous lives. As I prepare to launch my new Police and Crime Plan, DCA will be a vital partner in helping me to prevent the issues and risks that matter to our communities most.

Families, friends and neighbours are being encouraged to reach out to retired family members to encourage them to check their eligibility and apply. 21 December is the last possible date to make a successful backdated claim in order to receive the Winter Fuel Payment.

While around 1.4 million pensioners are already receiving Pension Credit, up to an estimated 880,000 households are eligible for the support but are not claiming it.

Pensioners whose weekly income is below £218.15 for a single person or £332.95 for a couple should check to see if they are eligible for this support which is worth £3,900 a year on average, using DWP's online calculator.

People with a severe disability, carers and those who are responsible for a child or young person who lives with them could get more. Pension Credit can also include extra amounts for certain housing costs, such as ground rent or service charges.

This work is part of a wider plan to ensure economic stability for pensioners by protecting the Triple Lock and supporting households with their energy bills through the £150 Warm Home Discount and the Warm Homes Plan upgrading millions of homes this Parliament. Over the next five years, more than 12 million pensioners could see their State Pension increase by over a thousand pounds as a result of the commitment to the Triple Lock.

Saturday 31st August Emirates FA Cup First Round Qualifying Aycliffe Earn FA Cup Replay

Newton Aycliffe earned a replay with a 1-1 draw against NPL-Premier side Bamber Bridge in the Emirates FA Cup. It was a game where both teams had chances to win, but the game stayed a stalemate after Charlie Dawson's 70th minute equaliser. Charlie also becomes the third member of his family to score in the FA Cup, following his cousin Dan and Uncle Bri. The home side started sharp, and Bamber Bridge could have

been 1-0 up within five minutes, but Lucas Weaver completely misjudged his shot and fired, high, despite been in a perfect position to score. Bamber Bridge would try to go forward, but Alex Nelson and Toby Pascoe would both be on defensive

duties to keep the opposition threat to a minimum.

Bamber Bridge would be the first to score when experienced striker Mark Cullen tapped in from close range to make it 1-0 in the 40th minute. It was almost an instant response, however, in the 44th minute, Cieran Jackson went on a long run and his low shot just barely stayed out the net. A few minutes later, in the 70th minute, several Aycliffe players got in a crowded box, and Ryan Lincoln Barrow's cross was whipped in and, after chaos in the box, found substitute Charlie Dawson and tapped in from close range. While Aycliffe had been soaking up some pressure, they were gradually growing into the game. The remainder of the second half, once again, saw Jim Pollard make excellent saves, as Aycliffe managed the end of the game very well to pick up a very credible 1-1 draw away to higher league
