

Some of you will know Lee from his work for the Town Council, others from his previous charity cycling challenges raising money for Prostate Cancer UK, Brain Tumour Research and Crohn's & Colitis UK.

Lee said "I'm taking vital steps towards ensuring veterans can get the support they need. This year I will be taking on Cycle September and cycling 500 kilometres to raise vital funds for life-changing mental health treatment for veterans.

Combat Stress is the UK's leading veterans' mental health charity, the work they do is life-changing and often lifesaving.

No one else does what they do. They provide the only intensive mental health treatment service to our UK veterans. Their services are provided across the UK, in-person and online. At a time that can be isolating and daunting, they are here to help.

N.A.F.C. REPORT



Newton Aycliffe progressed in both FA competitions this week, in both cases thanks to penalty shoot-outs.

On Tuesday they beat NPL Premier side Bamber Bridge in a replay to progress to the Second Qualifying Round of the Emirates FA Cup for only the second time in their history. Jake Petitjean's second half equaliser took the tie to extra time then spot kicks. All five of Aycliffe's penalties found the net to secure the win and a home tie against Warrington Rylands on Saturday 14th September (ko 3pm). In the Isuzu FA Trophy on Saturday Aycliffe had a long trip to Ellesmere Port to face NPL West's Vauxhall Motors.

The earlier periods of the first half saw Vauxhall Motors have many chances on target, the biggest let off, perhaps, when veteran forward Kevin Ellison's acrobatic finish hit the post, and his resulting rebound header was easily stopped by Jim Pollard. Just prior to this, Alex Nelson's superbly timed tackle denied George Nugent, who had beaten Pollard. Aycliffe were struggling on what was a very heavy and poorly cut pitch, but still had chances, and they'd go into the second half 1-0 up when, in the 45th minute, Cole Kiernan coolly slotted home after brilliant play from Jake Petitjean.

Vauxhall Motors started the second half on the front foot. Pollard was almost immediately forced into saves by Connor Rankin and Ellison. Jordan Wynne had tried his luck from outside the box early in the second half and, in the 70th minute, his long range shot was successful and made it 1-1. Both Cieran Jackson and Wayne Whitfield had chances late in the game. But Vauxhall Motors seemed more inclined to sit back and go for penalties.

For the second time in five days Aycliffe headed into a penalty shootout, coming out 3-2 winners with a fine Pollard save sealing the win & a trip to Emley in the next round.

Manager Brian Atkinson commented post match, "We did really exceptional today. It was a tough ask, especially since we went to extra time in another game earlier in the week. We produced against a decent team and it was nice to come out top on penalties, it just shows the team's character."

80,000+ Visit Cathedral



Almost 80,000 people visited Durham Cathedral over the summer and enjoyed the thousands of paper Peace Doves suspended under Durham Cathedral's historic Nave. Visitors from all around the world admired the art installation designed by Peter Walker, with many describing the collaborative artwork as 'stunning', 'mindblowing' and 'peaceful', with one person saying Peace Doves was an 'absolutely amazing exhibition'.

The artwork provided not only a great visual impression but also gave visitors the chance to reflect upon thousands of messages of peace, written by the public and community groups. From 26th July to 4th September, many people attended late-night openings and three-course dinners under the artwork.

Since April, people visiting Durham Cathedral were encouraged to write a message or prayer of peace, hope, love and friendship on a paper dove.

Community groups from the region were also involved with the mass-participation artwork, from Church groups, local school children, to members of Durham Cathedral's Community of Prayer, who are based all over the world and children from 1st Hartlepool Beavers, Squirrels and Cubs.

The artist's team then assembled the artwork suspending thousands of doves from the Lantern in the Central Tower. Peace Doves was illuminated by LED lights and accompanied by music from composer David Harper, creating an atmospheric experience as visitors wandered underneath.

The feedback will be used with existing research, crime figures and public correspondence to her office to draw up her Police and Crime Plan 2025-29 which will help steer the path of policing and crime prevention throughout her next term.

The PCC has become a respected voice in policing reform since her original election in 2021, taking on a growing list of national leadership responsibilities on behalf of the Association of Police and Crime Commissioners (APCC) including appointments as lead for Roads Policing (drink/drug driving), and Joint Lead for Addiction and Substance Misuse; Environment and Sustainability and Finance.

Passionate about delivering change, the PCC is adamant that local people call the shots on where their money is invested to keep them safe.

She said: "Durham Constabulary's officers work extremely hard to keep us safe, but we know we could do so much more with extra funding. Every penny is precious, and it is critical that we invest in the areas that will have the biggest impact on people's safety and feelings of safety.

"My survey is particularly keen to hear people's views on anti-social behaviour, drug use and dealing, dangerous driving, off-road bikes and crime reporting as these are issues that are raised with me frequently. The statistics show that alcohol and drugs are repeatedly a factor in so many reports of crime and anti-social behaviour.

"I would like to know where people feel we need to invest in solutions to make our communities more resistant to criminality and to restore confidence and trust in our services. "Our people and communities have a right to feel safe. I know they want a strong and visible policing presence so they can feel confident and safe. That's why their priorities will be my priorities.

"Please take a moment to share your views. I am here to represent the public and fight for the changes that will make a difference to your lives and the lives of your neighbours." The survey asks people where they believe the PCC should direct most funding, offering a list of potential priorities including anti-social behaviour, drug use and dealing, dangerous driving, off-road bikes and crime reporting. It's been another busy week as your MP for the Newton Aycliffe and Spennymoor Constituency.

I now have part of my staff team in place and we are working incredibly hard to respond to everyone that has been in touch with issues and concerns. We have responded to over 1000 emails and helped close to 500 people with individual cases that include benefit support, housing and education.

I am still in the process of recruiting another caseworker for my constituency office and I hope to have them in place soon. Whilst in Westminster, I met with the Director of Hitachi UK to continue my efforts to safeguard the 700 world-class engineering jobs in Newton Aycliffe. We had a positive discussion about the options currently being explored and I'm pleased to see that the Department for Transport have been in active negotiations with the Hitachi management team to address the potential gap in orders. I'll be speaking to Transport Ministers this week to ask for further updates.

I attended a number of key debates in Westminster Hall including the discussion around special educational needs (SEND) provision. This is an issue that's being raised with me regularly. I receive a large volume of emails from concerned parents and it's often raised on the doorstep across our area. I'm pleased Labour has hit the ground running on education reform to start to improve support for children with additional needs. The government has also started to improve the Ofsted rating system, so it's more transparent and fairer for students, families and teachers.

Back in the constituency, I met with Durham County Council's Cabinet and the senior leadership team along with the other County Durham MP's. This was an excellent opportunity to discuss concerns raised from residents such as transport, SEND and housing. I was very concerned to hear about the huge damage that the previous Tory government did to council budgets and the impact this has had on our county.

I also held my first constituency surgery, last week in Ferryhill. It was really useful to sit down with residents and provide face-to-face help with a range of issues. I have further surgeries throughout this month. My next surgery in Newton Aycliffe is the 20th September 1-3pm. If you'd like to book an appointment, please just drop me an email. Since being elected I've been pro-active in getting out and supporting the many brilliant organisations we are home to across our constituency. I attended Spennymoor Town show on Saturday, also calling in at the Horticultural show and mining museum. Whilst at the show I met with local councillors, charities and police. Then it was off to Ferryhill to a fundraising market in aid of the Mayor's charity. Whilst there I had a chat with Hannah at Brighter Futures to talk about how I can support her efforts in expanding their community pantry.
