## **Embracing the Change:** Menopause Support

A series of Menopause Peer Support Groups hosted by Wellbeing for Life (WBFL) are proving to be very popular, with fourteen women joining in one session alone. Groups take place at Newton Aycliffe Youth & Community Centre, Chilton Town Council and Shildon Football Club. They provide a safe space for women at any stage of menopause to come together, share experiences and coping strategies. The groups also welcome partners,

understanding that the effects of menopause

can be far reaching.
Attendees at the Chilton group range from
41 to 81 years of age, with positive feedback from all attending.

Teagan, aged 41, said: "When I saw the group advertised, I breathed a sigh of relief that I would be able to meet with like-minded people and on my doorstep too! Being perimenopausal and only 41, I was worried I wouldn't be listened too. I was wrong, all the help I've had has been super positive and I'm hoping this is a move in the right direction for women in the future. Thank you, Jules, and everyone at the Chilton group."

Pam, aged 81, said: "I'm impressed by the ways you are all supporting each other - keep

up the good work."

The different stages of menopause affect a wide age range of women and the symptoms can be both mental and physical including: changes to mood, like low mood, anxiety, mood swings and low self-esteem, problems with memory or concentration (brain fog), muscle aches and joint pains and changes to

body shape and weight gain. WBFL Facilitator Jules Howe, set the groups up and said: "They are about sharing lived experiences of all stages of menopause and about not feeling alone - sharing is caring." The inspiration came from Jules' own personal experience. She said: "I was



perimenopausal myself and realised that there was no face-to-face support within our local community. I joked about setting something up for friends, so we could chat about our menopause experience - it was something we all needed. WBFL gave me the green light to set up the first group - I was over the moon. We now host three and they are thriving! This support is very much needed and I'm so happy to be able to join them and see the difference it's making! According to a survey conducted by the British Menopause Society women suffered on average seven different symptoms of menopause, and 42% said their symptoms were worse or much worse than expected. 50% said their home lives had been impacted and more than a third said their work life had been impacted.

Jules' drive to support women experiencing the menopause hasn't stopped at the local groups, it is hoped to build on this success and set up similar ones across County Durham where there is a need. She has also spoken to Durham Hospital Radio and hosted a Menopause Café at County Durham and Darlington NHS Foundation Trust. up to my eyeballs in poorly hogs. I am trying to admit as many as I can because they are babies and juveniles, for instance, last week I admitted six, three are small babies, two of which came in last Friday, both less than 150g and on Monday morning another one from Grange Vets at Darlington, all on meds and doing well. I will not turn a hedgehog in need away and rehabbers are in short supply. It's very hard work, but I try very hard to make them all well and sometimes I fail. There are a lot here that are too small to release this year, overwintering maybe about 18 which is purely a guess at this time. Fundraising is still very much a big issue, it's quite a strain worrying about these beautiful mammals and money, so I thank everyone who has donated to this rescue, past and present.

Just a quick one this week, because I am

I am also grateful to Angela and the team of Grange Vets, most of what I need is here, from pain relief to antibiotics, if I need to reassess treatment it's already here.

Can I also ask finders when they bring hedgehogs to me not to use straw, I don't use straw in rescue, or paper, I like to use vet bedding for them because it's waterproof and doesn't make them uncomfortable especially when they are unwell.

If you find a hedgehog out in the day, it's not ok, so ring The British Hedgehog Preservation Society on 01584 890801.

It's been another busy week as your new Member of Parliament for the Newton Aycliffe and Spennymoor Constituency.

My team and I continue to work hard to respond to the letters and emails I've received from local residents. I've now helped over 500 residents who've come to me with particular problems. This has included providing assistance with a range of issues including housing, benefit support, child maintenance disputes and schooling. Many of these cases are very complex and require a significant amount of liaison with government departments to get things sorted, so I'm continuing to prioritise the most urgent cases. Please bear with me if you've been in touch about a wider issue.

Thank you to the many local residents who've applied for the Caseworker role in my constituency office. I'm now in the final stages of the recruitment process and hope to have the role filled very soon. Once in place, my team will be up to full strength, which means I'm able to help more residents, more quickly. As a newly elected MP, you start off with no staff, no offices and no IT! I've been working hard on this and am pleased to have recruited a new team much more quickly than many other new MPs. If you're having a problem, that you think I might be able to help with, please get in touch with me at alan. strickland.mp@parliament.uk

#### **Changes to Winter Fuel Payments**

I also welcome letters and emails setting out your thoughts on the issues of the day. I've had a number of emails from residents about the decision to target Winter Fuel Payments to those receiving Pension Credit. It's clear from my inbox that some residents are strongly against the change and others strongly are in favour.

Whatever your view on the change, it's important to set out why this difficult decision was taken. The new government inherited serious financial problems left behind by the last Conservative administration. Lots of promises were made that were never paid or budgeted for. That's forced the new government to have to find rapid savings to balance the books this year.

The Chancellor, Rachel Reeves, who's visited Aycliffe on a number of occasions, has made it clear that she didn't plan to make changes to Winter Fuel payments and didn't want to - but it's one of a number of savings that have had to be found to stabilise the economy and start to get Britain back on track.

The good news is that the Labour government's commitment to the Pension Triple Lock means the State Pension increased by £900 this year and will see pensions rise by over £1,000 during this Parliament. To make sure the poorest pensioners receive more help, the government has provided £421m to extend the Household Support Fund. This provides additional funding to those struggling to afford bills, food and household essentials, and can be accessed through Durham County Council who administer this on behalf of the government. In addition, the government's Warm Homes Plan will insulate thousands more homes, permanently bringing down energy bills and creating more local jobs.

Check whether you should be getting Pension Credit

My first term was a wonderful success, and I have many of you to thank for those achievements.

Back in 2021, you played an instrumental role in helping me to identify the issues that make our communities feel unsafe and impact your quality of life. It's a busy programme which sees us travel the length and breadth of County Durham and Darlington, putting local people in the driving seat of policing change. It's important to me that we speak to residents and businesses from all walks of life, backgrounds and communities, from farmers and landowners through to parents, students, civic leaders, volunteers and youth workers, so please come along and tell us what you think. I cannot emphasise how seriously we value your feedback. My Police and Crime Plan is your Police and Crime Plan. The issues that are important to you are important to me and your views, combined with crime data and public correspondence to my office, will set the tone for how we will approach pressing issues to your safety over the next four years.
