Emley 0 v Newton Aycliffe 3
Isuzu FA Trophy, Second Qualifying Round
Saturday 21st September

Newton Aycliffe continued their excellent run in cup competitions by defeating Emley 3-0 in the FA Trophy Second Qualifying Round. It was a game, on paper, where Aycliffe were certainly the underdog, but once again Brian Atkinson's side defied the odds with a marvellous performance. The win earns them a trip to NPL Premier side Whitby Town on Saturday 5th October.

At Emley, both sides exchanged attacks early in the first half, Amir Berchill's chip was the first attack of note, but it was easily dealt with by Jim Pollard. A few minutes later Dean Thexton's shot narrowly glanced wide. Cole Kiernan also came close to breaking the deadlock in the first half, but his shot was too high. As the first half wore on, Aycliffe became very comfortable and, on the stroke of half time, Ethan Wood's long range shot was initially saved, but Wood again found the ball and picked the perfect pass to tee up Thexton who expertly tapped in a poacher's finish to make it 1-0 in the 45th minute.

The second half saw Aycliffe run away with the tie, with Cole Kiernan getting two chances early in the second half, his powerful strike in the 54th minute forced a save out of Emley's Declan Lambton and Ethan Wood's low shot, that was parried out, found the head of Kiernan, but Emley's Lambton once again denied him.

In the 65th minute, the Emley defence didn't deal with Toby Pascoe's cross in time and Thexton once again took advantage to score a brace and make the game even more comfortable for Aycliffe with a 2-0 score line. It wouldn't just be in attack where Pascoe excelled, however, as in the 80th minute he cleared the ball away from an Aycliffe box filled with Emley players, this allowed Aycliffe to initiate a rapid counterattack which saw Liam Adamson find the feet of substitute Jake Petitjean who fired in a shot too powerful for Lambton to deal with to make it 3-0. The game would finish 3-0 in what was a brilliant away performance against opposition who held Aycliffe to a draw earlier in the season and a huge bounce back from Tuesday's away FA Cup defeat to Warrington Rylands.

Aycliffe now return to League action with away games at Heaton Stannington and Liversedge before returning to the Ashcourt Group Stadium on Tuesday 1st October when Sherwood Colliery will be the visitors.

Winter Fuel **Payments**

I have looked at the recent decision taken by the Government to stop winter fuel payments, and I can understand the reason why, given the massive debit the previous administration left. This, however, is my view, and that it is 'not everyone needs it', so it needs to be

The people who don't need it should have refused this payment, it should have been means tested from day one. I heard some people say, when it first came out, was 'well I've got my Christmas presents paid for now'. The Government have only so much money, so people need to decide how their tax is spent, do they want it spent on winter fuel or hospitals and other health related issues or the education of our children and build schools for the future, plus a whole load of other issues including local government grants to fund social services and other local services. I will be affected by this decision, but can cope. Let's see what the budget brings in October, with the Nurses asking for more than the 5% offered, the other alternative is higher tax or borrow more which needs to be paid

Last week I was invited by Durham Roads and Armed Policing Team to see the excellent work they are doing in partnership with Durham County Council to discourage dangerous driving on our roads.

The new road safety course was delivered to Durham County Council apprentices and covered the 'Fatal Four' driving behaviours linked to collisions - speeding, driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs, not wearing seat belts, and using mobile phones while driving.

Shocking statistics revealed that between 2019 and 2023 there were 441 road traffic collisions across the force area involving drivers aged between 16 and 24. Tragically thirteen of these were fatal while 97 were serious and 331 were slight.

And that's just drivers. The data also showed 74% of the casualties (aged between 17 and 24) were passengers. Alarmingly 40% of those aged between 16-18 were not wearing a seatbelt. This is something we have to address as too many lives are being lost as a result of not belting up.

Frustratingly, most of these collisions and, more importantly, deaths could have been prevented. This is why educating young drivers and potential passengers about dangerous driving is so important to us all. However, we don't just need to educate young drivers we need to educate the parents and grandparents who are often unaware of these heightened risks, despite paying for, or contributing to, driving lessons, car insurance and cars.

I know how shocked I was when I learnt about these statistics when I worked for the fire service and my son, at the time, was learning to drive. As a parent I was completely unaware of the increased risk of new drivers, particularly male drivers, carrying passengers and driving late at night.

Parents and grandparents can help us save precious lives by discouraging the 'Fatal 4' and encouraging the adoption of technology that promotes safe driving. For example, many insurers offer 'black box' telematics technology to young drivers. These devices monitor speed, driving style and other factors and can also be used to set curfews, so young drivers are not able to drive during high-risk hours, i.e. late at night.

Key risk factors for young drivers: Carrying passengers

 Newly qualified drivers with a car full of passengers of similar age are four times more likely to be in a fatal crash, compared with when driving alone.

Driving at night

· Young drivers have a higher proportion of crashes in the evenings and early mornings. Speeding

Young men are much more likely to be involved in a fatal crash caused by speeding than young female drivers, unfortunately young female passengers can be injured as a result of dangerous male drivers.

Mobile phones

 The RAC found around half of young people (aged 17-24) admitted to using their mobile phone behind the wheel, the highest proportion of all age categories.

Seat belts

 Young drivers and passengers may not always belt up when in a car with friends, due to peer pressure, despite the risk of death or serious injury in a collision.

Educating young drivers about road safety is key to saving lives. But, by extending this education to parents and grandparents, we can all work together to reduce the number of those killed and seriously injured on our roads. Life is too precious not to!

Acorn Grassington Adventure

at near wartime prices. The experience of walking through the jostling throng of people in the marketplace was amazing and a testimony to the organisers who provided the 1940s music and entertainment. Just a few of the acts were the Rum and Cola Girls, Paul and Mellissa Harper, The Blondies, Jeep Johnson, The Alka Seltzer Sisters and Mick Hull, all of whom were singing 40s tunes which had all of our

group foot tapping and singing along. Add to this a display of vintage vehicles and a full-sized spitfire in the market square, together with vintage market stalls, we encountered The Yorkshire Volunteers Corps of Drums resplendent in their bright red uniforms marching through the village. Shops stalls and pubs kept us busy all day and all too soon it was time to return home. The main comment from those who joined us was 'can we come again next

year?' and, of course, I must agree. Another fantastic adventure made perfect by the lovely people who accompanied us. Thank you all.

My new office team and I have been continuing to work hard through the Parliamentary Recess. Although Parliament isn't sitting, while party conferences take place, working hard for our constituency doesn't stop. I'd like to thank Great Aycliffe Town Council for inviting me to speak at their Full Council meeting. It was a good opportunity to formally introduce myself to the council and take questions from councillors from across the political parties. Having previously served as a councillor myself, for eight years, I know the importance of local democracy. In my speech I set out my pride in representing the town I was born and raised in and explained my priorities of jobs, youth opportunities and improving public services. I finished with a call to action to all of us, as public servants - town and county councillors, council officers and parliamentarians, to work together in the national interest to deliver for our community. I'm looking forward to working closely with the council throughout my tenure. Newton Aycliffe is my home, it's where I grew up and I'm determined to improve our town.

I also had an interesting meeting at the Pioneering Care Partnership in Aycliffe, seeing first-hand their range of integrated health, care and well-being activities. It was great to hear from the Our Options group and hear about the support for adults with additional needs. The centre runs a range of excellent activities, a bustling cafe, as well as hosting GP, nurse and mental health services – please make good use of the centre.

It was a privilege to help host the first Royal visit to the constituency since the General Election. I welcomed HRH the Duke of Edinburgh to the area to celebrate the 20th anniversary of Learning Curve, a recruitment and training company based in Spennymoor which works across the country. They do valuable work helping people into education and employment, well done to Brenda McLeish OBE and her excellent team.

A big priority for me every week is making sure we're working hard to respond to the emails I receive from constituents, with your issues and concerns. I've now completed over 700 individual pieces of casework with my team, helping with a wide range of issues. Being a rescuer has many difficulties, the hardest part is when we can't save a hedgehog, it's devastating, but we have to pick ourselves up and carry on regardless for the sake of the other small ones we care for, this was just such a case for Fern, she was brought in by my friend Joan last Thursday night, Fern flatly refused to uncurl so I placed her in a comfy bed with food and water etc, started meds Friday, as time progressed her condition worsened and when I managed to see her head and face it was clear that she had been attacked by another animal. Her eye was sticking out of its socket, the poor little girl passed away on Monday night peacefully.

On Friday morning I had another admission, a little girl, she was brought in by Sue and David, they don't live too far away but this poor girl had about 40 ticks removed, they were so fat these ticks that her tongue was pale with anaemia, lots of tlc was coming her way, she has a long way to go, but I'll keep my eyes on her and the other hoglets. Finally, earlier today, Tuesday 24th, Steve and Lesley found a female hedgehog, she has been named Daisy, near their drive, of course they picked her up and brought her in, comfy bed, nice food and out of harms way, like the others.

I would like to thank the finders, Steve and Lesley, also Sue and David for bringing in their little beauties, with donations as well. Can I also thank Anthony Burak for his kind donation, Jan Ratcliff for

her kind donation of food and Elaine for the books she has donated and anyone else that has made a donation to help me help these beautiful mammals. I hope to make some progress with them so I can get out and about fundraising but, unfortunately, my youngest son is unwell, he is 23, he does not speak, he ended up in Sunderland Royal overnight with severe breathing difficulties last Wednesday so, as you can appreciate, I have had my hands full.
