PCP Supports the Environment

Partnership working comes in various forms and the Pioneering Care Partnership (PCP) recently supported Shaw Trust. Health and wellbeing charity, PCP, donated wooden pallets from their recent renovations to Shaw Trust. Shaw Trust is a leading employment charity, who provide education and training for those starting out and those looking to progress in their jobs.

Gayle Goldsmith, Project Development Manager, said: "As PCP's hydrotherapy pool renovation nears the end, we had a large number of wooden pallets that we needed to dispose. Environmentally, PCP's waste hierarchy encourages us to either 'prevent, reuse, recycle and recover' before we move to disposing of waste. By connecting with Shaw Trust, PCP has enabled these to be reused and recycled."

Shaw Trust Enterprises, based in Seaham, will be repurposing these pallets by making kindling and other useful items that can be used to generate funds at their five-acre horticultural site, which works with adults with learning disabilities from across County Durham.

These funds will also support the team to grow more produce at their Seaham Garden Centre. This produce will be sold to raise funds enabling them to continue to support their activities.



This is just one step PCP have taken to protect the environment. PCP were recently awarded with the Silver Investors in the Environment award, after their application for the Bronze level exceeded expectations. This award encourages PCP to make conscious environmental choices, including repurposing and recycling, and schemes such as passenger mileage for staff, to encouraging car-sharing.

Autumn Exhibitions

Two thought-provoking exhibitions will provide first-hand insights into the experiences of young people in care and those with disabilities in the workplace.

Art Cares and Invisible Visible both opened at Bishop Auckland Town Hall on Wednesday 11th September.

Originally displayed in bus shelters across the region as part of the Art Stops project, Art Cares brings together 29 unique artworks by young people who have experienced living in care. The artworks share the young people's thoughts, feelings, and passions, while celebrating their diversity and sending out a clear message - 'We

are people, not problems'.
The exhibition will be on display in the Main Gallery at the Durham County Council venue, where visitors can also watch a documentary created by the young people about how art and creativity support them to express their emotions.

In the Strong Room Gallery, meanwhile, Invisible Visible invites an unflinching foray into the individual and collective experiences of those with disabilities in the workplace.

Created by Hope Caitlin Simpson, a 23-year-old poet, photographer and visual artist from Bishop Auckland, the exhibition details seven unique and anonymous first-hand accounts of being disabled in the workplace. Each account is translated into visual language to spark conversations around a topic that is often treated as taboo.

Hope, who has been chronically ill since the age of 11, said: "Being disabled can feel akin to being both invisible and hyper visible, without ever really feeling seen. I've spent most of my teenage years and those of a young adult, feeling the constant pressure to make myself smaller in order to fit into the world around me.

"This collection speaks to the reality that there is much more we can do in the world to make space and I hope those who can see themselves represented, can know their value is in every part of themselves." Hope created Invisible Visible in collaboration with the social enterprise organisation, Changing Relations, Bishop Auckland Town Hall and Durham University.

The exhibitions will be open to the public from Monday to Saturday, 10am to 4pm, until Saturday 30th November.

Government Save Aycliffe Coherent Plant



Defence Secretary John Healey MP visited Aycliffe to announce the government has acquired the semi-conductor plant in Aycliffe Business Park.

The factory, which was originally opened by Queen Elizabeth in 1991 as a Fujitsu plant, was at risk of closure after owners Coherent put the facility up for sale. 100 highly skilled jobs were at risk.

Mr Healey was welcomed to Aycliffe by new Member of Parliament Alan Strickland, who had been in talks about the future of the factory for some time. The Ministry of Defence stepped in to protect the production of semi-conductors, which are vital to the defence supply chain. Alan Strickland MP said: "After months of work behind the scenes with Labour's defence team I'm absolutely delighted that we have secured the future of this world-class plant. DURHAM POLICE AND CRIME COMMISSIONER



Don't suffer in silence from neighbourhood harassment.

As Police and Crime Commissioner, I receive a considerable amount of correspondence concerning neighbourhood harassment from victims who are dissatisfied with how the police and partners are dealing with their problems. Harassment is affecting a lot of people in our communities. In one year, there can be over 4,000 incidents of harassment reported to the

Resident's homes should be places where they feel safe and secure. Sadly, I know only too well, after meeting with victims alongside my Victims Champion, that this is not always the case. Victims of harassment can be subjected to regular and, sometimes daily, harassment and intimidation from their neighbours and this harassment can go unresolved for years. Neighbourhood harassment can take many forms, from verbal abuse and intimidation to more subtle forms of bullying, such as social exclusion or property damage. Living in such close proximity to one another, it's no surprise that disputes with neighbours can get heated and unpleasant quite quickly.

Common types of neighbour disputes:

noise, such as loud music and barking dogs

- · unpleasant remarks, name calling, threats,
- physical violence, damage to property or possessions.
- parking
- property boundaries
- overgrowing trees and hedges children playing in the street

Victims have told us how they feel like prisoners in their own homes, dreading encounters with those who are making their lives miserable. The psychological impact of such harassment can be profound, leading to feelings of helplessness, depression, and long term mental health issues.

Victims of harassment have been suffering in silence for too long. Unsure of who or where to turn for help or fearing that speaking out will only exacerbate their situation. As a result, those experiencing harassment often feel isolated, ignored and disbelieved.

Everyone has the right to live in peace in their own home without the fear of being bullied, harassed or intimidated by neighbours. The emotional and psychological toll of living in a hostile environment can lead to a decline in overall well-being. Not forgetting the victims children who can be deeply affected by the stress and anxiety that comes from living in a tense household, which can affect their development and mental health.

To raise awareness and improve signposting (so residents know which agency to report harassment to) I have rolled out 'Anti-Social Behaviour Don't Suffer in Silence' campaign to encourage victims to come forward and seek help from the correct agency, request case reviews and appeal decisions.

By raising awareness and fostering open communication, we can help those suffering in silence to reclaim their homes and their lives so they can once again live in peace and free from

How to resolve a neighbour dispute:

- 1. Try to solve the problem informally by talking to them as soon as possible.
- 2. If your neighbour is a tenant, you could contact their landlord.
- 3. You could use a mediation service, if raising the issue informally does not work.
- 4. If the dispute involves a statutory nuisance (something like loud music or barking dogs), you can make a complaint to your local council. 5. Contact the police if your neighbour is breaking the law by being violent or harassing
- you.
 6. As a last resort, you can take legal actions through the courts.



Promising Aycliffe play, shortly after, saw Cole Kiernan fire wide from very close range. Whitby had another chance courtesy of Jake Charles, Charles attempted to maneuver the ball around Jim Pollard, but Pollard once again utilised great reflexes to keep the score at 0-0. Dean Thexton, Cole Kiernan, Liam Jarvie and Cieran Jackson all had chances in the first half, but were either denied by Shane Bland (arguably Whitby's only standout player) or had their shots blocked by Whitby defenders.

Aycliffe ended the first half the much brighter side, and both Jarvie and Jackson had good chances early in the second half. Substitute Wayne Whitfield also had two chances, but both went high. At this point, Aycliffe could have realistically been at least three goals up, but Whitby stubbornly held on. Whitby's biggest chance came when Aaron Haswell's cross was picked up by Stephen Walker, Walker, however, cockily went for a backheel shot, which turned out to be a very poor decision when Pollard made yet another brilliant save to deny the Whitby forward. It seemed this was Whitby's final onslaught and now Aycliffe were once again in full possession. Returning forward Liam Jarvie had been a nuisance for Whitby all game and, whilst Bland dealt with his initial shot whilst one on one, Jarvie was quick to poach the ball into the back of the net to send the travelling Aycliffe support and Aycliffe bench into rapture. With the goal coming in the 84th minute, it was game set and match for Aycliffe who had thoroughly outclassed Whitby for the games entirety, creating yet another memorable day that Aycliffe fans will look back on fondly for many years to come.

I don't know where to begin this week, so I will tell you about Willow, she is a very small hedgehog brought in by Carol and Glenn last Thursday. They visited a caravan park about an hour away, when they saw this little hog out in the open looking at them, shivering in the cold. They immediately picked her up and they found my number. I said I was full, I agreed to take her in and what a shock I got! She was a mere 170g with fly eggs on her, I cleaned her up and started meds and I am glad to say she is doing ok for a little one. The poor lass would have been out all day in the cold looking for help, not even big enough to be without her mum or siblings, an hours journey straight to me, then the awful sound of my suction machine. Fly eggs are very bad for hedgehogs, flies lay eggs, hatch into maggots and eat big and small hogs, dead or alive. Very unpleasant, to say the least, speed is of the essence generally, but even more urgency when fly eggs are on a hog, the warmer the hog, the faster the eggs hatch into maggots. Carol and Glenn saved this beautiful little one's life, that's for sure. When you see a hedgehog out in the day, please get them help, firstly, put them in a high sided box with towels or something so they can hide, they are very scared of humans, bring them indoors, then if they try to do a runner they won't get far, seek help from The British Hedgehog Preservation Society on 01584 890801, they have a list of rehabbers, including me, on their database. Rehabbers never close, I work from home. If I can't admit a hedgehog, for whatever reason, I can provide help. All my rescued hedgehogs will not be leaving here before spring, the weather conditions are horrendous with no dry bedding and the temperatures will get colder. No time to build nests for hibernation which generally starts in November.

I hope to meet as many of you as possible at Tesco this week, I have some beautiful things on offer, an advent calendar with some beautiful gifts behind the doors, Hazel has made some lovely carvings, June says she will be with me and I have just found out that a lovely lady is making a Christmas Cake for a raffle prize, lots of other nice bits and pieces too, including some leaflets for you. Can I say finally a big thanks to everyone who has donated food and money, very much appreciated! I have more than 20 here that won't be leaving this year.

Also Antony Burak, I can't respond to your message, but I am delighted with your hog houses, please get in touch if you need anything, this applies to everyone who loves these beautiful mammals.



Conference recess is now over and Parliament is once again sitting. I've been working hard in the constituency and Westminster throughout the recess period, dealing with incoming queries and issues. I've had several good local wins for residents, including backdated Pension Credit claims, some of which are in the thousands. Close to 800,000 people across the country are entitled to Pension Credit, but don't claim it. I would encourage everyone to check their eligibility for Pension Credit here: https://www.gov.uk/pension-credit-calculator

I've been working around the constituency, meeting organisations and charities since becoming your Member of Parliament. Last week I met with the chief executive of Believe housing. We have roughly 1,300 homes in the constituency that are owned by this housing association. I get a lot of housing related casework, so it was a good opportunity to raise these issues in person with the organisation. As a former housing association director myself, we spoke about the challenges facing the sector and how I could help as the local MP.

I am back in Parliament this week and we look set for a busy legislative period. Several bills are currently progressing through parliament, these include:

Passenger Railway Services (Public Ownership) Bill - This Bill will take railway services into public ownership when the private contracts end. This change will tackle delays, cancellations and unreliable rail

Great British Energy Bill - The purpose of this Bill is to create a publicly owned energy company that will help our transition towards net zero, create well-paying jobs and get our energy bills down. Just last week we saw a £22bn investment in carbon capture and storage in Teesside. This will create 4,000 good, local jobs.

Budget Responsibility Act - A Bill to impose rules on the Treasury and the Office for Budget Responsibility to respect fiscal rules. This means we can never again have the disaster of Liz Truss style reforms that brought our country to its knees and sent mortgages through the roof. Renters Reform Bill - A major reform to our housing sector that will see an end to no-fault evictions and new rights for renters that include the right to own a pet. It will also allow tenants to challenge unfair rent increases, which is often raised locally with me.

Water Special Measures Bill - This Bill will allow the government to block the bonuses of executives who pollute waterways and ensure the independent monitoring of every outlet. The previous government allowed water companies to release sewage into our rivers.

These are just a few of the draft laws currently laid before parliament and it shows our commitment to deliver on the priorities that matter to us and our area. I look forward to supporting these measures when they come to the House of Commons.

When Choice **Becomes God**

Last weekend I watched a programme on BBC about assisted dying and there was a lot of talk about the right to choose, I think I have heard this before, I believe in the right to life, which comes from God, there is no question of choice. This choice is on a slippery slope. The beginnings at first were merely a subtle shift in the basic attitude of the physicians. It started with the acceptance of the attitude, basic in the euthanasia movement, that there is such a thing as a life not worthy to be lived. State-assisted suicide would have devastating outcomes for the most vulnerable and marginalised people in Britain.

Last week it emerged that an assisted suicide bill will be brought forward in the House of Commons, following a private member's bill ballot last month.

The Bill, from Labour's Kim Leadbeater - who placed first in the ballot - would allow doctors to prescribe lethal medications to terminally ill people.

Improving the care that people with terminal illnesses receive should be a political priority. However, 'assisted dying' must not be part of the answer. Legalising this practice would undermine suicide prevention, damage the bond of trust between doctors and patients, fuel negative attitudes towards individuals with serious health conditions and disabled people, and see marginalised Britons choosing to end their lives because they lack sufficient health and welfare support. We believe the state has a moral duty to protect the public from these outcomes. Better support for Hospice care, killing the vulnerable is not the answer. In 2015, MPs overwhelmingly rejected a change in the law. Even MPs who supported the idea of assisted suicide in principle said they did not believe it is possible to legislate for it without endangering vulnerable Britons. The strong evidence for this position has not changed in the intervening years. In fact, reports from Canada, the Benelux countries, Australia, and the United States, paint a troubling picture of how these laws operate in practice. We would urge MPs to heed critics' concerns and say no to assisted suicide. There is a better path forward. Vince Crosby.
