# **Healthier Future For All**





Health and wellbeing charity, the Pioneering Care Partnership (PCP) has launched its long-awaited renovations at its healthy living hub, the Pioneering Care Centre in Newton Aycliffe.

The transformative project for the community includes two extensions. The first includes a new hydrotherapy pool and changing facilities, replacing the old pool that was struggling to meet demand. The new pool has doubled in size to support a growing demand for hydrotherapy, with more appointments available.

PCP's Options service for adults with learning and physical disabilities has benefitted from investment, with a much-needed extension and kitchenette, providing members with more space to learn, thrive and develop key day-to-day living skills. Carol Gaskarth, PCP's Chief Executive, expressed her excitement about the improvements and said: "As a charity, this is the start of an exciting journey for PCP, after years of planning, fundraising, and securing grants, PCP invested over £1 million to bring this ambitious project to life and ensure we can continue to support as many people as possible with our charity mission of 'Health, Wellbeing and Learning for All'. "Our Options service room has also doubled in size, giving members more space to take part in different sessions. We wanted to put Option's

name at the heart of their sessions, giving them more 'options' to choose activities that help them develop skills such as cooking, gardening and independent life skills that they can use outside of the Options service. "As well as improvements for PCP's Options service, the Pioneering Care Centre offered over 17,000 hydrotherapy appointments annually, but PCP couldn't keep up with the demand for appointments from people across the region. It shows how hydrotherapy benefits so many people, and the investment into facilities enables PCP to offer more appointments, giving more people the chance to 'make a wave' and reap the benefits of hydrotherapy.' Valuable user feedback has helped

PCP ensure new facilities meet accessibility requirements, with improved changing rooms, hoist equipment, state-of-the-art water jets, sensory features, and an overall relaxing ambience where people can come together to enjoy hydrotherapy. Eileen, a PCP hydrotherapy pool user, said: "My 24-year-old daughter has a rare genetic disorder. She is autistic and doesn't talk at all. She also has limited mobility. When we go to the hydrotherapy pool, she loves the whole sensory experience. I can tell from her body language that she is relaxed and happy. I am limited in activities we can enjoy together, and we both appreciate the time





together including a nice coffee and a sandwich in the cafe afterwards. "There are definite physical and mental health benefits for my daughter and, as a carer, I feel it helps aches and pains in my back as well as the emotional boost of quality time spent together."

The centre developments are now complete. Anyone can book to use PCP's hydrotherapy pool, without a referral to support recovery, pain management or simply to relax. To book a session, visit the Pioneering Care Centre reception desk in the main entrance or call 01325 321234.

# **DURHAM POLICE AND** CRIME COMMISSIONER



Illegally driven and dangerous off-road bikes (off-road vehicles include: quad bikes, electric scooters, go-peds and trials bikes) are amongst the most common complaints raised by local residents, who are understandably concerned about reckless riders causing a significant amount of harassment, alarm, and distress in their local communities.

These inconsiderate riders are often seen riding without helmets and wearing balaclavas, putting their lives and the lives of others in mortal danger. These riders do not only pose a significant danger to the public, but they are also causing a huge amount of environmental damage and noise

To combat this problem, I am funding a range of schemes and investing in advanced technology to help officers identify, pursue and apprehend offenders. For example, Section 59 warning signs have been effected in hot spot areas. These signs give police officers the power to seize offending off-road bikes, quads or 4x4's immediately and, whenever possible, bikes will be confiscated and crushed so they cannot be returned or resold. I am also investing in new state of the art technologies, such as drones, to revolutionise our approach to tackling off-road bikes. Drones enable officers to track and trace illegal off-road vehicles and their riders. Equipped with highresolution cameras, drones can cover large areas very quickly, capturing real-time footage of illegal activities and images of the perpetrators. Aerial footage not only identifies the locations where bikes are being stored, but also assists in tracking the offender to where they can be located and

In addition to drones, everyday technology such as CCTV, doorbell cameras and smartphones can capture footage of offending off-road bikes. This information can provide crucial evidence that can lead to successful prosecutions. Every photo or piece of footage we receive helps us to build a bigger picture, identify offenders and keep people

#### The law relating to off road bikes:

- It is illegal to drive or ride a mechanically propelled vehicle without lawful authority on common land, moorland or land not forming part of a road, or on any road which is a footpath,
- bridleway or restricted byway.
   Under section 34 of the Road Traffic Act 1988 the driving of motor vehicles off road and on public lead to published. land is prohibited.
- Persons riding a quad bike on a footpath, bridleway or restricted bridleway would be guilty of an offence under the Countryside and Rights of Way Act 2000.
- Even if someone has permission to ride a quad bike on land, if they are found to be riding 'dangerously' or 'carelessly' they would be guilty of an offence, even when they are driving off-road.
- Under Section 59 Police Reform Act 2002. officers can seize vehicles which are being used illegally, including prohibited off-road use.
- · Noise issues can be dealt with by the local council under statutory nuisance noise legislation as provided by the Environmental Protection Act
- If riders are caught causing criminal damage, they can be arrested under the Criminal Damage Act 1971

- Or report to Crimestoppers (100% anonymously) by calling 0800 555 111 or visiting crimestoppers.

# Ten Reasons to Oppose Assisted Suicide

Dear Sir.

The 'name and addressed supplied' writer in last week's Newton News, misses the point as he didn't give his/her name, I will try to address the writer as him. I have been through the people dying from cancer in my family. My mother-in-law had cancer and died at 56 my brother-in-law, a fire officer, died at 54 with cancer, then my sister-in-law also died of cancer. In each case, they had the treatment of the hospice.

I oppose the legalisation of assisted suicide out of concern for the good of every person in society, the protection of this good in law, and the spiritual and pastoral care of the sick and dying.

My opposition is a matter of human reason, as well as religious faith: assisted suicide is inherently wrong and the evidence from other jurisdictions shows there can be no safe or limited assisted suicide law.

Clarity of language is central to effective public debate on important moral issues. The use of the term 'assisted dying' in this inquiry endorses the euphemism that assisted suicide means compassionate assistance in dying rather than the prescription of lethal medication. The ten reasons were used in evidence at the Health and Social Care Committee in 2023.

1/ Life is a gift and equally valuable, even in times of suffering;

2/ Assisted suicide is based on a flawed idea of autonomy;

3/ Assisted suicide is based on a misleading view of compassion;

4/ Calling assisted suicide 'dignity in dying' ultimately passes judgement on the value of human life;

5/ Assisted suicide undermines the medical duty to care for patients;

6/ Assisted suicide undervalues the lives of people with disabilities;

7/ People may choose assisted suicide because they feel like a burden;

8/ We cannot know for sure if people seeking assisted suicide have full mental capacity; 9/ Legalising assisted suicide is likely to lead to a slippery slope;

10/ Investing in palliative care is a better way to support people suffering at the end of life. Rather than legalising assisted suicide, I, along with others, strongly support greater Government investment in the availability and accessibility of specialist palliative care across the country. I would like to reiterate the Catholic Church's commitment to protecting and valuing life at all stages, no matter how physically or psychologically limited, and our opposition to assisted suicide as an attack on the inherent dignity of human life.

Offers of places will be made to parents on 3rd March 2025.

For applications completed online, offers will be received by email. For applications sent by post, offers will be received by letter. These should arrive by no later than 5th March 2025.

The third quarter started with another quick goal from Kyle, followed by more goals from Thomas, Kyle and Finley which resulted in a 6-12 win by the end of this quarter.





# **Gum Busters**



A dusk 'til dawn blitz on chewing gum is underway in Durham City.

The work is taking place over the next month, with cleansing teams hitting the streets from 8pm to 4am to get the job done with minimal disruption to the public.

The blitz is funded by a £27,418 grant that Durham County Council has secured from the Chewing Gum Task Force, which is managed by environmental charity Keep Britain Tidy. It will start on Claypath, before moving on to Silver Street and Framwellgate Bridge and finishing on North Road.

Research has shown that similar schemes in other parts of the country have had lasting effects, with a reduced rate of gum littering still being observed six months after clean-up. Allison Ogden-Newton OBE, Keep Britain Tidy's chief executive, said: "Chewing gum litter is highly visible on our high streets, so the support for councils, provided by the Chewing Gum Task Force and the gum manufacturers, is very welcome.

"However, once the gum has been cleaned up, it is vital to remind the public that when it comes to litter, whether it's gum or anything else, there is only one place it should be - in

"That is why the behaviour change element of the task force's work is so important." Keep Britain Tidy estimates that cleaning up chewing gum costs UK councils around £7million a year, and around 77 per cent of England's streets are stained with gum. The Chewing Gum Task Force is funded by major gum manufacturers including Mars Wrigley and Perfetti Van Melle.

# **Council Tax Reduction** Scheme Extended

Councillors have agreed to extend a council tax reduction scheme which supports County Durham's most vulnerable residents. Durham County Council's Local Council Tax Reduction Scheme offers a council tax discount to eligible residents on low incomes, whether in work, unemployed or retired.

Just over 53,800 residents are currently benefitting from the scheme, with more than 41,000 receiving the maximum 100 per cent discount, meaning they pay no council tax.

At the Full Council meeting, it was agreed that the scheme would continue unchanged for another year.

Cllr Richard Bell, the council's deputy leader and Cabinet member for finance, said: "We understand that our residents are feeling huge pressure on their household budgets but we are determined to do what we can to protect those who are most vulnerable. We would also encourage households who are struggling to seek help and find out what support is available".
