PCC's Spotlight on Rural Crime

Police and Crime Commissioner Joy Allen has shared details of the significant projects underway to protect rural communities and businesses from crime as a national week of action launches.

National Rural Crime Action Week ran from 21st to 25th October and highlighted the improvements being made to tackle rural crime and enhance support for rural residents, farmers and businesses.

The PCC recently unveiled the Rurali project which represents one of the biggest investments to date in rural crime prevention in the county. The project has seen more than £200k of Safer Streets funding directed into two new Ruralwatch Coordinators and a dedicated intelligence officer to capture and develop intelligence gleaned from Ruralwatch WhatsApp groups.

The new initiative will ensure more of the public's concerns and suspicions about rural crime are actioned as early as possible to prevent further harm and losses, bring more criminals to justice, and to increase feelings of safety in the countryside.

Commissioner Allen said: "Rural crime has a profound effect on the people who live, work or visit our countryside. From dog fouling and flytipping, through to illegal hunting, hare coursing and plant theft, rural communities are plagued by unique problems that require a unique response. This is why, as PCC, I have worked hard to bring the experts together to see what work we need to do – collectively – to make our rural communities safer. And I have backed this up with substantial investment to ensure we have the tools and technology to respond to the problems that matter most to our rural communities.

"No one knows our communities better than the people who live in them. This is why it is so important to me to empower residents to play their part, and this is the key aim of the Rurali project. This initiative will provide the infrastructure needed to be able to quickly action any risks or threats to prevent further harm and losses in our countryside."

NFU Mutual's latest figures estimate the cost of rural crime in the North East at £8.6m in 2023 - a 7.3% increase on the previous year - while nationally the figure stands at £52.8m.

Success to date:

Since first being elected in 2021, the County Durham and Darlington PCC has undertaken extensive engagement with rural residents, farmers and businesses to determine the issues that impact them most.

Previous survey data revealed a huge proportion of rural residents in the county had experienced fly-tipping incidents (82%) while 23% of rural residents said they had experienced vehicle theft. Livestock theft (19%), dog attacks on livestock (15%), crop damage (9%) and plant theft (9%)

were also high on the list.

Rural residents also frequently raise issues of anti-social behaviour (ASB), speeding, off-road biking, illegal hunting, wildlife cruelty, drug dealing/use, dog fouling and vandalism as problems that negatively impact their lives. In response, the PCC included 'Safer Countryside' as a key priority in her original Police and Crime Plan

She funded new Community Speedwatch vans with onboard technology to clock multiple speeding motorists in rural communities as well as automatic number plate recognition (ANPR) cameras to track the movement of offenders and stolen machinery through the county. She also funded GPS trackers and other advanced technology including drones to support the work of investigating officers.

Last year, the PCC agreed to invest £20k into 10 new re-deployable CCTV cameras and related equipment in support of Durham County Council's work to target fly-tipping hotspots across the county and bring more offenders to justice. And to address the menace of off-road bikes, the PCC contributed funding towards Operation Endurance - an all-year-round operation which sees officers seizing bikes on the spot if they are being ridden illegally and anti-socially. The force now uses a range of tactics including drone technology to tackle this top public concern. As part of an ongoing crackdown on ASB, the PCC secured a place in the national 'hotspot policing' pilot and associated Immediate Justice scheme which has delivered thousands of extra patrols across rural and urban areas of the county and perpetrators made to 'give back' to their communities as punishment.

More recently, the PCC unveiled the Rurali project which represents one of the biggest investments to date in rural crime prevention in the county and has seen more than £200k of Safer Streets funding directed into two new Ruralwatch Coordinators and a dedicated intelligence officer to capture and develop intelligence gleaned from Ruralwatch WhatsApp groups.

The new initiative will ensure more of the public's concerns and suspicions about rural crime are actioned as early as possible to prevent further harm and losses, bring more criminals to justice, and to increase feelings of safety in the countryside.

The Commissioner or members of her team will be visiting rural communities throughout National Rural Crime Action Week to raise awareness of Rurali and how it will benefit rural communities and businesses, as well as how to get involved. This includes visits to Darlington Farmers Mart and St John's Chapel Tupp Sale and Show in Barnard Castle and a Rurali launch event at Satley Parish Hall in Bishop Auckland.


£200 Donation

Newton Aycliffe 4 v Consett 1 Tuesday 22nd October

Newton Aycliffe completed an emphatic 4-1 win against local rivals Consett AFC. It was a brilliant performance where Dean Thexton shone as he bagged a hat trick and the Man of the Match award. It was the first time Aycliffe had defeated Consett since August 2021. Aycliffe first had the ball in the net within the third minute, but Liam Jarvie's rebound was quickly deemed offside. The home side were not discouraged however, as in the seventh minute Jarvie this time assisted a goal as his cross found an oncoming Thexton who easily headed it past Consett keeper Harry Moss. Consett equalised in the 22nd minute when a corner from Jake Orrell found the head of Brandon Holdsworth. This was probably the zenith of Consett's night however. The second half saw Aycliffe run away with the game and they were

The second half saw Aycliffe run away with the game and they were immediately the better side, as demonstrated when Liam Jarvie expertly weaved past Consett's Calvin Smith to pass to Dean Thexton at close range who gently poked the ball into the bottom corner to make it 2-1. Aycliffe were simply free scoring now, in the 54th minute Thexton

bagged his hattrick when Liam Adamson's looped cross allowed the ball to find his head, which he easily headed home, making it 3-1. The 88th minute saw Aycliffe undisputedly seal the points when Cieran Jackson broke away from Consett's Liam College who struck the ball past Moss into the bottom right corner. Capping off a great home win for Brian Atkinson's side against something of a 'bogey team' in recent years, with Consett's last loss at Moore Lane coming in February 2020. On Saturday, Aycliffe moved on to Stockton Town in the Isuzu FA Trophy. Aycliffe had achieved a fantastic win at Premier division side Whitby Town in the last round. However, their fellow Step 3 team, Stockton, proved too strong for Aycliffe on this occasion. Stockton opened the scoring with less than five minutes gone, subjecting Aycliffe to considerable pressure. However, they were unable to extend their lead. Aycliffe fought back in the second half and Dean Thexton headed an equaliser with twenty minutes to go. Just as the 850-strong crowd, including many travelling fans, were thinking of a penalty shoot-out, Stockton grabbed the winner on eighty five minutes. Despite the loss, Aycliffe can be immensely proud of their cup exploits this year. Attention now turns back to the league with four consecutive home games: Pontefract Collieries on 29th October, Carlton Town on 2nd November, Bradford (Park Avenue) on 9th November and Ashington on 12th November. I've been working hard alongside my colleague, Lola McEvoy MP, to raise residents' concerns about the Newton Aycliffe Landfill site. Last week I visited the site with Lola and officials from the Environment Agency to discuss concerns around the odour problems from the site with the owners, Ashcourt Group. This follows my earlier request for an urgent update from the Environment Agency on the situation at the quarry.

On site, we discussed residents' concerns and received a briefing from the senior management team of Ashcourt Group. It was clear, and very welcome, that important steps had been taken to address these issues, including £3m of works to improve the management of landfill gases.

The key test here is whether the evidence shows air quality has improved in the area as a result of these works. I've asked the Environment Agency and the UK Health and Security Agency for the latest round of results of their air quality monitoring. I will continue to monitor the situation and share the latest results once I have them.

Residents have also been in touch to raise concerns that another operator on the industrial estate is also generating foul odours. I asked the Environment Agency to investigate this and am meeting them to hear about the progress made.

I'm really pleased that my staff team is now up to full strength, and we're working hard to serve our local communities. Please email me on alan.strickland.mp@parliament.uk if there is anything you think I can help with.

I held a constituency advice surgery in Newton Aycliffe last week. Thank you to the residents that attended to discuss important issues. Thank you also to Newton Aycliffe Youth and Community Centre for hosting me.

Ex-GB Triathlete Writes Letter to Past-Self

A woman from School Aycliffe who suffered catastrophic injuries in a cycling crash in 2017, has written a letter to her former self, to highlight the long-term and complex recovery thousands of people face each year after suffering lifechanging injuries.

Melanie Varley, who has competed at the World Triathlon Championships with the Great Britain Age-Group Team, was out cycling on a group ride on a steep downhill on the B6275 near Darlington, when another rider lost control of their bike, sending her flying from her bike. Melanie spent five days in hospital with injuries including a fractured spine, multiple right shoulder fractures, a collapsed lung and nerve damage. But she spent years recovering from her broken bones and a mild brain injury she sustained in the crash.

She is among a group of major trauma survivors who have written letters to their former selves as part of a new campaign launched for charity Day One Trauma Support's Major Trauma Awareness Week.

In moving videos and letters available to watch and read online, the 'Dear me' campaign gives an honest and enlightening glimpse into what it's like coping with life-changing injuries and an inspiring insight into rebuilding life after major trauma.

The road to recovery is one that Melanie is still on. Due to her injuries, she has had to give up her business as a self-employed osteopath. But her physiotherapy and rehabilitation means she has begun taking part in aquathlons once more and has been selected to represent the GB agegroup team at the European Championships. In her letter, Melanie, now 57, has drawn attention to the lack of support, particularly finding the right legal support, that she received at the time of the accident and now volunteers with charity Day One Trauma Support. As a peer support volunteer, she is there for others who have experienced life-changing injuries, something she would have found beneficial at the time.

Dear Melanie,

It's now seven years since another rider crashed into you at high speed.

As an osteopath you knew that you were lucky you hadn't been killed or paralysed. You were a strong, determined, fit woman, who had represented GB at the age group World Triathlon Championships. Most importantly you were wife to Peter, mother to William and India, and ran your own business.

PTSD, sleep and fatigue issues were horrible. A lengthy legal case and finding the right legal support until you had all the right people fighting your corner. Dealing with the DWP was horrendous. Being told that you were fit for work, when you and other medics knew this wasn't the case. Having a strong work ethic, and wanting to return to work, you were upset that you knew you couldn't.

Your loss of your business and your role as an osteopath helping people was massive. One of the worst parts is that you've had to leave your triathlon club and the sport you love so much. You recall feeling lonely and isolated for the first time in your life. You wanted people to understand how you were feeling, but how could they? This was your journey You felt you needed to be in a support group, where you could talk to people who had similar experiences to you, but you didn't know of one. You weren't super woman, just human.



Your darling husband, children, family and friends were on the journey with you. They were worried for you. You finally received a full year of rehabilitation with an amazing team. This team, with your new solicitor, understood you and where you needed to get to.

The journey should have been easier. You'd been let down. And you still get angry about what we have been put through as a family. In 2024 you discover Day One Trauma Support. You always said you didn't want anyone to have to go through the journey as you did, and you want to help people on their journey and make a difference. Now you are doing this and making a difference. It's the end of term, and this is your report to yourself.

Well done, Melanie, you survived and have got to this stage. Life is so precious, and everything can change in a split second.

You still have more work to do, but keep moving forward and embrace everything life has to offer you. New beginnings are on the horizon. Best wishes, Melanie



I have just googled Aycliffe town centre, in the day, and how better it was when the road ran through the middle.



Last week I had some visitors, some students studying for their Honours Degree came to interview me and meet the hedgehogs in rescue, little Andy the Hedgehog was very sociable, they were all very polite and kind, I wish them the very best of luck, if the film we made is any good it will possibly get on national TV, so I will let you know when I know. Also Don and Claire came and donated some much needed items that are needed to run the rescue and keep the hoggies clean and healthy, thank you! Also Madge and hubby called with a cash donation. Thank you both, I hope I got your name right, and Bev. Also Wendy, Mandy, Donella and Wally of Grannies Choice are always very helpful please take some time to visit them, it's a wonderful place to visit. Finally my thanks go to June for making some beautiful blankets for these babies, they love them. Everything goes to the hoggies.

I will be doing my raffle and scratch card very soon, I have a beautiful Christmas Cake which is the first prize and my scratch card will have a cash prize, I will put everything on my Facebook page, I need to feed 22 little mouths 'til spring. This is little Amelia, cute little girl eh? 


Aycliffe U15 Angels 6 v Auckland Moor 1
