The medal is awarded to a member or group of members who have served the cause of model flying and the Society by their particularly meritorious or sustained endeavors.

Barry Robinson was awarded the SMAE Medal for his great commitment Control Line Aerobatics (Class F2B), and for the great number of years that he has represented the UK in both World and European Championships.

Barry represented the UK in 33 out of 43 European and World Control Line Championships between 1979 and 2024. In 1979 he went to Marville in France, as a substitute, along with Bill Draper and Peter Tindal. He placed 6th, the best placed British flier and the team secured the Bronze medal. This was the first in a run, achieving two Gold Team medals (1987 and 1989) and three Bronze Team medals (1979, 1983 and 1985). Barry was the best placed UK flyer in 14 of these events.

He qualified for a team place virtually every year, but financial and other constraints meant he was unable to attend all of the events for which he had qualified.

Domestically he has won the Gold Trophy for F2B at the National Championships eight times between 1980 and 2006. He has also been the highest placed British pilot when there were Foreign winners of the Gold Trophy. Barry has also won Classic Aerobatics twice adding to these achievements. Home International events saw Barry represent England in numerous events, the majority of which were won by England. Barry has won many other cups and trophies, competing in CLAPA events (four times champion) and events run by model clubs throughout the UK.

Barry has also been a member of the Control Line Technical Committee, and has judged the Nationals, Centralised events and many other Control Line aerobatic events.

Barry has always helped other modeller's to improve both their models, suggesting trim changes etc. and their schedule flying. The most recent being Steve White of the Shildon Model Flying Club (SMFC), who Barry coached to become the F2B National Champion on three occasions.

Barry is also very active at club level. For ten years he has been Secretary of Shildon Model Flying Club. He has liaised with the Land Agent to secure a new flying field since the loss of their previous site in 2022, allowing for outdoor flying to recommence. He has been cutting the flying patch on his own for the last twelve years, and he assists in the running of indoor flying meetings organised by SMFC.



## Hitachi, Job Not Yet Done

As someone who spent my entire time in Parliament supporting Hitachi I am delighted to see last weeks announcements. It's a real credit to all involved and clearly the primary credit goes to the management and staff. The need to continue Government focus though is only just beginning, whilst my successor would have you think this is all due to him and his party I can't see anything they actually did so far other than offer verbal support. The contracts gained were open tender and not Government funded. However, as his Government is on an agenda to renationalise our railways their opportunity is coming fast. Future steps will likely require real Government support in investing in rolling stock contracts to enable Hitachi to bid for (and hopefully win). The contracts so far will not secure the long term future of Hitachi as Kier Starmer has claimed. They are a first step in building the bridge needed to the bigger contracts that are in the long term pipeline but they do not complete the bridge, more are needed. We must not let him think it's job done. It is imperative that we all continue to pressure Government to help complete the job. If the PM and my successor actually contribute to that delivery I will be the first to say well done, but, so far, it looks like something that happened on their watch that they are claiming credit for rather than something they have done. We still need them to find that pen and live up to their promises.

# **Stitching Kindness Into the Community**



Since launching in October last year, Pioneering Care Partnership's (PCP) Knitting Group has been weaving threads of warmth and kindness into the North East community. Founded by volunteer Sharon Rowley and Annette Allen, PCP Customer and Information Assistant, this talented group has combined their passion for craft with a heartfelt mission to support others and combat loneliness.

It brings a tear to my eye seeing the goals of the group become a reality when we get the pictures of people wearing the items we have created, it is creating a literal blanket of care covering the North East."

The Knitting Group has become a hub for creativity, companionship, and giving back to the community, reflecting the values of PCP. Every stitch tells a story of care, and their collective efforts have touched countless lives.

After two long years of campaigning for the future of Hitachi trains in Newton Aycliffe, I was delighted to welcome back Keir Starmer to announce a crucial £500 million deal.

After jobs were threatened by Tory dither and delay, this saves the factory and protects hundreds of jobs at the site. This landmark agreement is the culmination of years of dedicated lobbying, both as a parliamentary candidate and now as your Member of Parliament. Ensuring this outcome has been my top priority and I have raised it at every opportunity in the House of Commons and in discussions with ministers. I'm proud of my fellow North East Labour MPs and North East Mayor Kim McGuinness who've joined my campaign and advocated strongly for the plant in Newton Aycliffe. This victory is vital for our town, our local community and our economy.

Hitachi is a good employer, hiring hundreds of local residents and trains staff up to be highly skilled engineers. It makes world-class products and is exactly the sort of firm we want to keep and see grow.

The problem was that while the factory has a strong order book now and in the future, the previous government procured new trains in a way that left an unsustainable gap in orders. This problem also hit other train factories in the UK. Despite the Rail Industry Association warning about this looming crisis for years, the last government did nothing. When I first brought Keir Starmer to the Newton Aycliffe site, he committed to pulling out all the stops to help tackle the production gap and build a sustainable future for the plant. Keir kept his word. On Friday, I joined him and the Transport Secretary, Heidi Alexander, as he announced the deal to save the factory and secure hundreds of jobs. The agreement was reached between Hitachi, Angel, and First Group, for 14 new trains, totalling 70 new carriages. The Department for Transport played a crucial role in the negotiations and established the conditions necessary for the deal's success. This highlights the impact of having a proactive Labour MP and a Labour government.

My work doesn't end there. The government and Hitachi are still involved in active negotiations about a number of other options and I will continue to advocate for the factory and its employees. This facility is vital not only for our town but also for the broader UK rail manufacturing industry. The government has an ambitious rail strategy that includes public ownership, and I am working to ensure world class manufacturers like Hitachi are a key component of it.

I'm really glad that we were able to make this announcement before Christmas. While there's still work to do, I know from speaking to factory workers with Keir that this announcement has brought significant relief. And, as this is the last Newton News edition before Christmas, please can I wish you and your family all the very best for a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year. ## PM Secures Hitachi

Local Member of Parliament Alan Strickland welcomed Prime Minister Keir Starmer back to Hitachi, where he announced a £500 million deal to help save the factory. This agreement, negotiated by the Government, Hitachi, First Group



and Angel Trains, secures hundreds of jobs at the Aycliffe plant. The plant had been facing a production gap between major orders, leaving employees concerned about the future. The announcement by the Prime Minister comes after a two-year campaign run by Alan Strickland, the Northern Echo and union representatives. Alan Strickland MP said: "I've been clear since day one that securing the future of Hitachi is my top priority. Dither and delay by the previous government caused serious problems for the plant and the hundreds of people who work there. I'm proud that, by working tirelessly with ministers and the rail industry, I've secured this major step forward within months of the election. This world-class factory is a huge asset to our area and deserves our support."



# **Christmas Tree Recycling**

Households throughout Newton Aycliffe are being asked to support one of the region's most valued hospices by registering their used Christmas trees to be recycled into environmentally friendly biomass fuel.

Darlington Rotary Club has launched its annual Christmas tree collection for St. Teresa's Hospice and, early in January, will tour local streets collecting the trees. Rotary club organiser David Hayward said: "We have 70 volunteers and 20 large vans all ready to go."

"Everyone wins from this venture as we spare the homeowner from mess disposing of their trees and the hospice gains much needed funds."

January's operation is hoped to be the largest yet since the scheme started 14 years ago, with the Rotary Club so far raising over £89,000 for the hospice. Hospice chief executive, Nicola Myers, said: "This is one of our major fundraising campaigns and we really appreciate the help of Rotary and the generosity of local residents. Every year we have to raise over two thirds of our £4 million annual running costs to continue offering palliative care and support to over 1000 local residents." Everything is loaned free. Vans are supplied by hire companies Enterprise and Charter; Darlington's Taylor Pies café acts as the operation's base and trees are chipped by tree surgeons Greenworx and Jackson Trees.

The collection, over the weekend of 4th and 5th January, will include the whole of Newton Aycliffe, Heighington, Darlington and surrounding areas.
