Proposal to Amalgamate Two Aycliffe Schools

A proposal to combine an infant school with a neighbouring junior school, to ensure the best possible outcomes for children, will be considered by councillors next week. Durham County Council's Cabinet will hear that amalgamating Horndale County Infant and Nursery School and St Francis Church of England (C of E) Aided Junior School in Newton Aycliffe would help to sustain both schools by ensuring sufficient pupil numbers. St Francis C of E Junior School, like many other primary schools in the town, currently has surplus spaces. Horndale's numbers, meanwhile, have been declining in recent years, resulting in funding challenges. A shortfall in the last financial year was covered by a Department for Education School Deficit Grant, but this is a one-off payment and cannot be relied upon to balance the school's budget in the future.

Both schools were rated Good in their latest Ofsted reports and are located less than 20 metres apart from each other, with a shared access road and car park. Plans to combine the schools have been widely supported by staff, governors and parents.

The proposal would see the schools amalgamated and the creation of newly named C of E primary school for children aged three to eleven from September 2025. A public consultation was carried out in September and October last year. This included meetings with staff and governors and an event for parents and the wider community to find out more and ask questions. Ninety percent of those who took part in the consultation agreed or strongly agreed with the proposal and six percent neither agreed nor disagreed.

After considering these responses, a statutory notice to amalgamate the two schools was published on Monday 4th November following which people had four weeks to express objections or support. The council received no further representations during this time.

Cabinet will be asked to approve the proposals when it meets at County Hall on Wednesday 15th January.

National Knife Angel Monument to Visit Newton Aycliffe



A national monument to highlight the dangers of knife crime is coming to Newton Aycliffe. The Knife Angel - constructed using 100,000 seized blades and weighing in at 3.5 tonnes - will officially be installed in Newton Aycliffe town centre on 1st June 2025.

The sculpture was created by artist Alfie Bradley, from The British Ironwork Centre, using blunted blades handed in during knife amnesties held by police forces across the country, the angel has been helping to start crucial conversations about the negative effect of violence and particularly knife crime since it began touring the country in 2018. It is particularly poignant for Newton Aycliffe after one of the town's teenagers, Jack Woodley, lost his life to knife crime in 2021. The 18-year-old was attending a funfair in Houghton-le-Spring when he was attacked by ten other teenagers and stabbed. Despite the best efforts of the emergency services, Jack sadly passed away in hospital. The ten teenagers were found guilty of murder and sentenced to life in prison.

Since then, Jack's mum, Zoe McGill, has been working with Newton Aycliffe Neighbourhood Policing Team sergeant, Andy Boyd, to add her story to workshops delivered by Sgt. Boyd to thousands of schoolchildren in the town.

Ms McGill said she hoped the arrival of the Knife Angel would further bring home the message that knife crime devastates families. She said: "We feel truly honoured to be bringing the Knife Angel to Jack's home town and I know Jack would be so proud of the efforts of those who helped make it happen. Sadly, not every knife crime incident is reported until it becomes another statistic and too little too late. That statistic is felt so much more to the victim's loved ones and family for the rest of their lives and the ripple effect is never known to those who have been fortunate enough to not have lost a loved one. "I am hoping and praying the Knife Angel stops such a tragedy ever coming to Jack's home town. The grief of losing a loved one to this senseless crime is too much to bear and I feel we need to somehow connect with the public and our younger generation in order to help them feel our pain through Jack's story

so they never want to carry a knife again. If we can save even one family from this pain, that is enough."

Anyone caught with a knife can face up to four years in prison. Sgt. Boyd added: "Delivering educational packages in our schools has been a passion of the Neighbourhood Police Team for a number of years now to keep our kids safe. Although we don't have a huge problem with knife crime in Newton Aycliffe, it is so important to get ahead of the curve to prevent rises in violent behaviour.

"Zoe has been so brave in adding Jacks story to our presentations which lets our kids know just how impactive this type of crime has on family, friends and community. When she reached out to us, with regards to bringing Knife Angel to Newton Aycliffe, we were only too happy oblige."

The sculpture will be installed in the town centre's mall throughout June, with a whole calendar of activities planned for the community. Schoolchildren will also be invited to get involved with special visits to the angel with a poster and photography competitions planned.

Joy Allen, Police and Crime Commissioner for County Durham and Darlington, added: "I am proud to support efforts to bring the Knife Angel to the force area for the very first time. This powerful national monument continues to send a strong and poignant message to communities across the nation that all forms of violence are unacceptable.

"Thankfully, we do not have the same level of serious violence in Durham as the larger metropolitan areas, but every life lost and every injury on our streets is one too many and wholly preventable. We must work harder to deliver campaigns and interventions that stop young people from carrying knives from day one, before they have an opportunity to cause unthinkable harm."

£500 Million Deal to Safeguard Hitachi

Government helps deliver a train-building deal that will give Hitachi's Newton Aycliffe site a future - helping protect hundreds of jobs.

FirstGroup, Hitachi and Angel Trains have struck a deal to build 14 state-of-the-art trains to be used on rail lines across the UK, as part of a £500 million deal that will uplift the industrial heartlands, and boost rail services for passengers across the UK.

The Government has delivered meaningful engagement, a stable economy, and a proper strategy for rail, which has created the right atmosphere for this deal to happen.

The Northeast is key to the UK's industrial heartlands, and this sensible approach - which has been supported by the Northeast Mayor Kim McGuinness and the Local MP Alan Strickland - is ensuring this region isn't being left behind. It follows the Prime Minister visiting the manufacturing plant in April and promising to help secure jobs. The announcement comes as the Prime Minister and the Transport Secretary visit the site to speak to staff and hear first hand of the benefits that rail passengers will feel as a result of this new deal. In the face of that shocking inheritance, the Government will always stand with working people. That was made clear in the new Plan for Change, announced by the Prime Minister. This deal reflects a new way of doing business - a grown-up approach to industrial relations that puts country first. It proves the pipeline for orders is strong, with a number of operators in the market for new trains providing contract opportunities for all UK rolling stock manufacturers.

The agreement will deliver 14 new five-car class 80X Hitachi electric or bi-mode trains (a total of 70 cars). Delivery of the new trains is expected to commence in late 2027. In addition, the agreement provides FirstGroup the options to lease up to a further 13 five-car trains, should their recently submitted other open access applications be successful.

The success of our industrial heartlands is the success of our nation. So the Government is revitalising our railway industry. British trains used to be the envy of the world. This government is going to return our railways to that golden era once more - treating those who build our infrastructure with respect and putting the passengers who use it first. Jim Brewin, Chief Director of UK & Ireland at Hitachi Rail, stated: "This contract is a positive step forward, and just recognition for the hard work and patience of our teams across the Hitachi Rail UK business over recent years. We look forward to once again delivering for Hull Trains and Lumo passengers who will benefit further from our award-winning British built trains. Equally, we owe a debt of thanks to the Northeast Mayor Kim McGuinness and other local MPs who have worked tirelessly in support of this private sector investment."



I want to start by wishing all Newton News readers a very Happy New Year and all the very best for 2025.

I'd also like to say a special thank you to all those in our community who worked over Christmas and New Year to keep us all safe by making sure our essential local services were running. To our doctors, nurses, police officers, fire fighters, paramedics and everyone who missed family Christmases to serve our community, thank you for your dedication. My Mam worked at Aycliffe Hospital, and now in the care sector, so I know first hand the huge sacrifice many people make over

The year 2024 marked a significant milestone. Since my election as your local MP, I have been advocating for our community and addressing the issues that matter most to us. Securing the future of the Hitachi Rail factory in Newton Aycliffe has been my top priority. The plant's future was uncertain due to the previous government's indecision, which jeopardised the future of the world-class

Before Christmas, the Prime Minister came to Aycliffe to announce a ground-breaking £500 million deal with First Group and Angel Trains to ensure the factory's sustainability. This achievement is the culmination of months of negotiations and advocacy with Hitachi's management team, the Department for Transport, and private contractors. The Tories had given up on the factory, but I will never give up on our community and the jobs we need.

I'm continuing to work hard with Ministers on the other live negotiations we have on additional potential orders for the factory. This is important for the jobs there and the 1,500 in the local supply chain that support the plant.

I was also proud in 2024 to work with the Defence Secretary to secure the future of Octric Semiconductors (previously Fujitsu/Coherent) through a £20 million agreement aimed at safeguarding the UK's defence supply of semiconductor chips. I'm working with Ministers to promote growth and expand opportunities at this crucial factory, so it can offer more skilled engineering and high-tech jobs for our area.

I was born, raised and live in Aycliffe, and am proud of the town. I promised to hit the ground running if I became our MP and I'm really pleased to have already secured these big wins for us. Another priority of mine is to make our streets safer, which is why I am pleased to see the government has pledged £1 billion in funding for police forces, including additional funding for Durham Constabulary. This financial boost will allow for an increased police presence in our local neighbourhoods. There will be a key emphasis on addressing anti-social behaviour and tackling persistent offenders.

Happy 2025 to all of you who take the time and trouble to read my article and also a very special thank you to Paul and the Newton News team for printing this. I need every reader to know that these beautiful mammals have very challenging lives out there in the wild and I want all of us to take some responsibility to make it easier for them by making hedgehog highways in your garden fences, putting food out, the Tesco



Kitten kibble is a big hit with our wildies, it's not expensive either. I am happy to say that I have managed to keep 26 hedgehogs here for overwintering, a mixture of boys, girls, big and small. Thanks to Angela and her team of vets, I have managed to obtain the various life saving treatments, antibiotics, fluids and pain killers, of course these items don't come cheap. I have just managed to get a bottle of antibiotic and it's a good one which cost over £100, so it's not just about food, it's about bedding, medicines, microscope slides and cleaning supplies. The list is endless and I can't afford to be without any of these items, I have 13 cages and two hoggies per cage, it's very hard work because five cages overspill into the kitchen and garden room overnight. My home is still very clean though.

Hedgehogs in rescue can still fall ill, at the moment I have Amelia, Buster and Bobby who have Giardia, this is quite a nasty illness and can make their behaviour erratic, treatment has started and all the signs are good, so don't worry Elaine, Bobby is going to be fine. Buster from School Aycliffe (pictured) is a very tricky little hog. He refuses to take his meds orally, so I have to get them into him another way, some of his meds are injectable, but not the one for his Giardia. Patience is a virtue, he can't win, especially when he loves his puppy mousse.

Most hedgehogs will be hibernating now, especially when the overnight temperatures are below zero, there is no food out there, but I have been told that some visitors have called to Steve and Lesley's garden recently, bless them they always put food on and so do I. I would like to thank everyone who make donations that go to my hedgehogs, I try very hard to save money with some success too, a few weeks ago I took the time and trouble to ring Royal Canin in Somerset, I asked if they help hedgehogs which they replied 'yes' they do, so now I am a Royal Canin Professional Partner because I run a rescue! This means I don't pay full price for their foods which all my hoggies, past and present, love. If you can get a hog to eat, half the battle has been won. I also use washable puppy pads, recommended by Donella at Grannies Choice, the money I save goes towards food and meds. Thank you Donella.
