



## Sedgefield Water Polo **Club Promoted to Div 1**



Sedgefield Water Polo Club, based in Newton Aycliffe, has made history by earning promotion to Division 1 of the British Water Polo League (BWPL). This remarkable achievement marks their fourth consecutive promotion since the men's team was formed in 2021. The club, which represents a small community, now stands among the elite teams in British water polo, with the opportunity to compete for European qualification in the upcoming season.

#### A Remarkable Journey to the Top

Sedgefield's journey began in Division 5 just four seasons ago, and their rapid rise through the leagues has been nothing short of extraordinary. From early struggles in their debut season to securing crucial signings, such as Ben Stephenson and John Pratt, the club has continuously strengthened its squad. Each season, they have faced and overcome tougher competition, culminating in their latest success in Championship 1, where a five-game winning streak secured their spot in the top division.

Despite their success, Sedgefield faces unique challenges. The club trains in a shallow-deep pool, whereas competitive matches are played in fully deep pools, making their rise to the top even more impressive. Additionally, the men's national league team trains just once a week, with the club remaining heavily focused on junior development. However, their strong team spirit and unwavering determination have propelled them to remarkable heights.

#### **Looking Ahead**

As they prepare for their debut season in Division 1, Sedgefield will face some of the biggest names in British water polo, including Manchester and Cheltenham. The success of the Sedgefield national league team is something that should provide huge pride for everyone in Newton Aycliffe, Sedgefield and the surrounding area. The success of the club is a testament to what can be achieved when likeminded people put their mind to something and stick together when things get tough. A town the size of Newton Aycliffe with a team in the top division of a British sports league is something that should be celebrated and Sedgefield will hope to continue to punch above their weight in the coming years.

(Temporary Public Rights of Way Closure) Order 2025

Government Act 1972 Darlington Borough Council proposes to make an Order under Section 14(1) of The Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, to prohibit all traffic from proceeding on the following lengths of footpath and bridleway. Footpath closure Footpath Number 8, Great Aycliffe Parish: An 820 metre length that extends generally south westward from the road A167. Bridleway closure Bridleway Number 10, Great Aycliffe Parish: A 1.04 kilometre length that extends southwards from the east-west section of Footpath Number 11, south of the Industrial Estate to Bridleway 4, Coatham Mundeville Parish at the county boundary to enable new site development works to be undertaken. Alternative routes will be signed on site during the works, once available. The maximum duration of the Order is 6 months. The proposed works are to commence on Monday 14/4/2025 and are required for the duration of the works. On occasions, alternative dates for the closure may be necessary and these will be signed on site accordingly.

The County Council of Durham (Greenfield and Meadowfield Ways, Newton Aycliffe) (Temporary Road Closure)

The Council proposes to make an Order under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended, to prohibit all vehicular traffic from proceeding on the following lengths of road. Greenfield Way, a 470 metre length that extends south westerly from the south western access to the garage/car valeting establishment. Meadowfield Way, a 50 metre length extending south from Greenfield Way, Newton Aycliffe to enable carriageway resurfacing works to be undertaken. An alternative route will be available to vehicular traffic from the north eastern side of the closure, from Middridge Road/Greenfield Way south easterly on Burn Lane, south westerly on Burnhill Way to the junction with Meadowfield Way, or continuing south westerly then northerly and north westerly onto Greenfield Way, to the south western side of the closure and vice versa. The maximum duration of the Order is 18 months. The proposed works are to commence on Saturday 12/4/2025 and are anticipated to be completed in 16 days (daily between 7am-7pm). On occasions, alternative dates for the closure may be necessary and these will be signed on site accordingly.



As part of the many exciting events taking place this year to celebrate 200 years since the start of the modern railway with the opening of the Stockton & Darlington Railway, County Councillors in Durham have joined forces with the Friends of the Stockton & Darlington Railway to give primary school children a treat.

Each child in schools located along the old railway line will be given a free copy of Little Loco's BIG Day written by local archaeologist Caroline Hardie and illustrated by fellow archaeologist John Pickin. This beautifully illustrated tale from the rails is about the opening of the pioneering Stockton & Darlington Railway on the 27th September 1825 and features Little Loco and her friends Herald the Horse, Wonky Waggons, George the Genius and Talented Timothy. A special dedication at the beginning will encourage the next generation to be the bold, enterprising innovators of the future and help change the world for the better. 

## **Canalathon Ultra Marathon Runner**

Dear Sir,

My name is Michael Thompson and I will be running the 100k (62 mile) Canalathon Ultra Marathon for the men's mental health charity Manhealth. This is held on Sunday 30th March from Sowerby Bridge to Manchester and back along the Rochdale Canal.

My first Ultra Marathon was back in April 2016 and I have been doing them every other year (apart from 2020, due to Covid). Whilst I have just moved into Newton Aycliffe, last summer, my ultra training always went along the railway path from Shildon and usually into Shildon. This year I have run past my previous home near Raby Castle in Teesdale.

I have been through a few mental struggles myself, looking after my father during Covid, when he stopped in bed and his legs weakened, I also looked after my brother who has learning difficulties and maintained an acre of land, then moving out when he died and more beside, before eventually moving to Newton Aycliffe.

Completing these events for men's mental health charities, and therefore learning about suicide, has definitely helped. Suicide is the

## **Heighington Matters**

Many residents have received a letter from OpenReach, offering an opportunity to upgrade their broadband speeds by visiting their website and signing up for the deal. Over 65% of residents have already contacted OpenReach and completed the simple forms. However, I have received emails and been stopped in the street with questions about its authenticity and concerns about the website's functionality. Having been closely involved with a similar scheme in the western villages of my Ward, I can assure you that it is worth signing up, as the new system will use fibre directly to your home.

To register, simply visit the OpenReach website, 'Connect My Community'. Enter your postcode, and a message will confirm if your area is eligible for the upgrade. If your house is included, enter your address and submit the form. You will then be registered. Once OpenReach reaches their target, a second message will be sent to you, asking you to pledge your acceptance of the improved speed. This will generate a £4500 contribution towards the overall cost of the upgrade. There is usually a short planning period for OpenReach to organise the installation and notify householders of the work schedule.

This is a great scheme, offering significantly improved broadband speeds at no cost to residents. It will also provide a confident answer when prospective buyers inquire about broadband speeds in your area

**Walworth Road Housing Estate** 

Despite numerous inquiries to Darlington Borough Council (DBC) regarding the start and completion times for the outstanding work on Walworth Road and the estate entrance, there is still no definite date from Bellways. I apologise for the umpteenth time. I will continue to ask the question, and I'm sure DBC will keep pursuing the matter. It is difficult for me to understand the delay and why DBC cannot insist on a start date.

#### **Brafferton – Ashcourts Land Fill Site**

Recently, I organised a meeting with Ashcourt, the Environment Agency (EA), and the residents of Brafferton. During the meeting, Ashcourt presented a report, and the EA provided information on the emissions from the site over a period of time. It was noted that there have been few obnoxious emissions since before December. This was confirmed by one of our residents, who has kept a daily record for the last few months. Since much of the odour from the site is generated during the drilling process, Ashcourt has committed to notifying us when the next round of drilling is scheduled to start, so that local residents can be informed in advance.


## Yard Clean Up
